Neighborhood Partner Training

Two offerings of the Neighborhood Partner Training will be held on September 20 and September 26 at 9:30 am in the Andice Room at Cowan Creek. The training will last about an hour. Partners only need to attend one.

The training will include what the Firewise Group does, why embers are the concern, how Partners can help the Firewise program, and more.

Drought Monitor for Texas

The current Williamson County drought status by the Drought Monitor is EXCEPTIONAL DROUGHT. As of August 31 data, over 98% of Texas is in some level of drought. This is up from almost 20% since August 1. The outlook for September is for the drought to continue.

The U.S. Drought Monitor is a map released, with discussion, each Thursday morning, showing where drought is and how bad it is across the U.S. and its territories. The map uses six classifications:

- normal conditions - no drought
- abnormally dry (D0) - areas that may be going into or are coming out of drought
- moderate (D1)
- severe (D2)
- extreme (D3)
- exceptional (D4)

There are options to compare between dates, animations of how conditions have changed over time, and more.

The Drought Monitor for Texas is available each Thursday morning. Click [here](#) for the Texas Drought Monitor.

Also available is the [North American Drought Monitor](#) which comes out monthly, reflecting drought conditions across the entire continent.

Firewise Volunteer Clearing Crew News

What a hot and dry summer we're having. The Firewise Clearing Crew says "Look around, and you'll see plenty of things that you can do to help reduce the chances of fires on your property and around your homes".

- Pick up dead limbs and leaves around your home and yard/beds.
- Remove combustible and non-fire retardant items from the outside patios.
- Keep your water hoses hooked up to the water spigots to quickly extinguish a fire.

Also, please remember not to put trash or yard waste into the Level 3 common areas (up to 30 feet beyond your property line). Yard waste should be bagged and set out on the first recycle of the month. (Check on Georgetown City's [web-site](#) for additional information.)

The Clearing Crew is "patiently" waiting for September to cool down just a bit more before we head back out, helping the CA to help keep our community "Firewise Safe". Be sure to do your part too.
