David Hubbell, Firewise Group Chair A continued warning about the danger of snakes, scorpions, and spiders and to watch for them when we go through junk in the garage or debris and mulch in the garden. Another warning is that folks are seeing centipedes including the Texas red-headed centipede which can measure 5 to 12 inches long. They can inject venom using huge pinchers. Unless a person has an allergic reaction, the bite is like a bee sting with localized swelling and pain that subsides in hours. So be careful and be aware!
