Hazards of Drought Conditions

The Drought Monitor on July 5 shows the Sun City area as being in severe drought to extreme drought. Soaking rains over time are needed to reduce the drought conditions. The late June rainfall had little effect on the drought.

Georgetown Fire Department has been responding to vegetation fires in recent weeks. The difference between a vegetation fire and a wildfire is primarly wind speed. On July 3, a 600 acre fire occurred about 2 miles north of Sun City. It was contained within 3 days.

The dry conditions in Sun City increase the potential for vegetation fires to start. Dry grass and other fine fuels are easy to ignite. Ignition can be as simple as smoking material, automobile exhaust, and many more Ignition sources.

Drought Monitor - Texas (<u>link</u>) is released every Thursday morning.

Vegetation Fires in Sun City

Vegetation fires occurred in 2008 and 2011. Both were small and the vegetation recovered quickly.

The 2008 fire was on the Bonita Loop of Tranquility Trail and covered about 10 acres. Georgetown Fire Department controlled the fire.

The 2011 fire originated near the fifth green of Cowan Creek Golf Course. It reached Cool Springs Way and then crossed McKinney Falls Lane and Cooper Lake Drive . Georgetown Fire Department stopped it before it reached Palmetto Drive.

In 2014, a fire occurred just outside Sun City behind Walgreens. It was about 6 acres in size. The Hacienda Retirement complex is being built in the space.


Sun City currently has about 800 acres of common area with just over 1,000 acres projected at build out. Areas range from about 100 acres to a few thousand square feet.
