# Firewise Town Hall - Embers, Fuel Breaks, Fire Breaks, Houses

October 4, 9:30 am, SCB

How do fuel breaks and fire breaks reduce embers, the primary wildfire hazard for Sun City?

Drought and nearby wildfires have gotten the attention of Sun City residents. Extensive research relating to wildfire spread has found that over 80% of structures are ignited by embers from wildfires.

Having fire control preparations using fuel breaks and fire breaks can reduce the danger. These control measures are practiced in Sun City using both.

The resident applies these to their home and the surrounding yard.

Sun City maintains fuel breaks in neighborhoods, golf courses, and other common Sun City areas. There are also fire breaks around houses, community buildings and other areas.

Our Firewise Town Hall this year will explaining the difference and function with examples of each.

Texas A&M Forest Service, Georgetown Fire Department, and Georgetown Emergency Management Coordinator will each have a short presentation.

Additionally, we have invited the Emergency Management Committee, COPs (Citizens on Patrol), Property & Grounds Committee, and Wildlife Management Committee to be available to answer questions you might have regarding their function.
