Bocce is a wonderful game full of skill and strategy and can be played on almost any surface and anywhere. It is not limited to just Sun City, Georgetown. If you're looking for Bocce outside Georgetown, you might try joining the Major League Bocce in Austin, Texas.

Email <u>majorleaguebocce.com</u> and select city- Austin. They play year-round on outdoor courts for six weeks with two weeks for playoffs. Days of play are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday at different locations in the City. Teams consist of 5 or more players with a cost of \$55 per person. Another idea would be adopting Pickleball's idea called Intercommunity Pickleball Meet. They meet quarterly for a one day and play with three other communities: Kissing Tree San Marcos, Del Webb San Antonio, and Del Webb Houston. These three communities also have Bocce Courts. The Texas State Senior Games are a group of senior athletes that compete in more than twenty different sports categories, ranging from Pickleball to tennis, track and volleyball and more. Athletes, including men and women ages fifty and over compete in five-year age increments. Gold, silver, and bronze medals are awarded in each category. San Antonio host the Games every April with over two thousand athletes from across the United States participating. At present time Bocce is not a Scheduled event. Not too long ago neither was Pickleball. Chuck Flannigan, who lives in Sun City, played an important role in getting Pickleball as one of the sports in the Senior Games. If we have any interest in getting Bocce as an event in the Senior Games, let me know.

The last item of interest is a Company called Packaworld. It is out of New Zealand and they make portable Bocce Courts (Packabocce). 'Packabocce' is a portable bocce court. Just roll it out of the bag, pump it up and in less than 10 mins you're ready to play. They have three sizes; the largest 60'x12' at a cost of \$1500. The court consists of six inflatable tubes with Velcro strapping. The complete Court comes stored in an oversized duffle bag.

Question from Volume 3: How do I roll the Bocce ball?

Guess the best answer is there is no right or wrong way to roll the Bocce Ball, whatever works for you. There are things to try to avoid when throwing the Bocce ball however. The first thing to remember is that it is not a bowling ball, and the court is not an alley. There are no groves in the court. You cannot hook the Bocce ball successfully. So, do not turn your wrist, that is called steering the ball. The idea is to be as consistent as possible, that you can roll the ball where you want it. Do not allow it to have a mind of its own. Secondly, watch where you release the ball. Releasing it at different heights in your approach will cause the ball to go differently every time. Some people like to release it at their side, others like to release it in front of them. Whichever method you choose stick to it, develop it, practice and just be consistent.

Question: Do you know what they call hitting the back board? OUT! no, really. In international rules this is called a Burned Ball. A rolled Bocce ball that hits the backboard without hitting any other ball on the court is called a burned ball. It is removed from the court and does not count. Any ball that was hit by this ball after it hits the backboard must be returned to its original place on the court. Remember if it hits a ball in the field of play and then hits the backboard it is a playable ball.

Question: Who governs Bocce play and Tournaments in the United States? Thought you would never ask. It is the United States Bocce Foundation. Check the website for some great, information and background about Bocce. It is the official authority for all Bocce questions. Not me for sure, regardless of what you may think.

The February 3rd sessions included instructions on how to play bocce using International Rules. All who attended at least two of the three sessions were awarded Completion Certificates. There was great participation in all sessions, regardless of weather conditions.
