The end of the year is rapidly approaching and we're in the celebration of the Holiday Season. For the Board and myself, I would like to wish all of you a happy and safe New Year.

I wanted to mention some highlights from our General Meeting. Our membership has grown to 204 Members. My personal goal was to reach a membership of 200, and we have exceeded my goal!

We're extremely proud of our Bocce Activities that gave back to the community this year. Among those service projects were the Canned Soup Day and Stock the Food Bank. All the food went to ***The Caring Place***. Bocce volunteers hosted 24 Special Needs Kids from Georgetown ISD. We made friends with the kids, taught them how to play Bocce and fed them hot dogs for lunch. We also sponsored a Breast Cancer Awareness Event that raised \$380.00. The money was sent to Strides Against Breast Cancer.

Other accomplishments at the General meeting were:

1. The members voted for revisions to our Club Bylaws allowing online voting (35-0).
2. Officers for 2018 were elected (35-0).
3. Two surveys were completed by attending members, one on League Play and the other on Social Events.

The results from the ***League Play Survey***:

- 22/12 are interested in playing in a regular league.
- 17/11 were interested in "Skill Leveled" play.
- Overwhelming people would play for a lunch after a Tournament.
- There was interest in playing in the Annual Club Championship and in Neighborhood Tournaments.

The ***Social Survey*** revealed:

- Meeting on Patio after events was a favorite.
- Themes that got the most votes were: Root Beer Floats, Ice Cream Bars, Watermelon Day, Beer and Brats Men's Event.
- Events where we gave back to the community were also very popular.

We don't have a lot of scheduled events for December because of the weather and people have such busy schedules, **BUT** look out for random **Bocce Blue Light Days**. When the weather looks promising, we'll send out an early morning notice on the Bocce Website of a time we can all meet at the Courts for three fun games of Bocce.

TREASURER'S REPORT-DOUG BRUMM



Well, with so many good Bocce players in Sun City Texas it takes a lot of guts to write this article. I did not volunteer, I was asked. A lot of you do not even know me, so let me tell you something about myself and my Bocce experience. Really that is all you are concerned about, anyway.

Let me start by saying I am training New Members to Sun City Texas about the game of Bocce and how to join our club and participate in League Play.

2018 Ladies Bocce League Play

The first Ladies Bocce League of 2018 will be at **3pm Monday, January 8th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th** with **February 5th** only if needed due to a bad weather cancellation. We will play 3 games with no time limit and using Sun City Rules. We have courts 2 through 5 reserved for us so we can have up to 16 players. Cut off for sign-ups will be one week before the first day of play (January 2nd, 2018)

I promised that I would let everyone know ahead of time when league play is scheduled for the entire year so everyone can plan ahead and play as often as possible. So here is that information:

We will play 5 leagues during the year with each league lasting 4 weeks.

There will be one week at the end of each league reserved in case we have to cancel a day's play due to bad weather.

These dates will be on the 2018 calendar online at the Bocce website as well:

League #1- 3pm on Mon. January 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th — (Feb. 5th if needed)

League #2- 3pm on Tues. February 27th, March 6th, 13th, 20th — (Mar. 27th if needed)

League #3- 9am on Wed. April 18th, 25th, May 2nd, 9th — (April 16th if needed)

League #4- 9am on Thurs. June 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th — (July 5th if needed)

League #5- 9am on Friday September 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th — (Oct. 5th if needed)

There will be a reminder email sent out before each league for sign-ups and we hope you come out and have fun playing Bocce.

USING THE BOCCE WEBSITE

Anyone who knows me knows that I am not a computer Geek, but for the past year I have had to learn how to use our website (Bocce) within the CA's website infrastructure. To put things onto the Bocce Website, I had to first learn how to create a Document Library, use the Navigation Site, how to display a Banner Image, write Club Announcements, create Inserts and Quick Links. And that's not all. I had to learn how to store pdf files in the File Library, Upload photos and images and store them in the Image Library or the Image Album, update the online Calendar of events, meetings, and classes, plus learn how to use the Email and Mail Administrator. It has been a massive undertaking and sometimes overwhelming. It has brought me to tears many times. With the help of Rob McFall and Don Webb, I feel confident when making changes or adding to the website today. The most important lesson I have learned is, "Don't let the website INTIMIDATE you! I'm sharing this story with you because I want to encourage you to begin using the website and take the time to explore our website.

First, think of the website as a big file cabinet. The Bocce Club is the owner of the website, when the owner adds something to the website, all she must do is put the file into the cabinet then you the members on the internet will be able to see the contents of the file. This file can be a picture, a story, an announcement, an event, an important date, league play, etc. The owner can also remove or update a file.

Why look at the website:


- It can provide current information and news about Bocce Events, League Play, Socials, and important dates
- By having a website we can show-off what we do as a club and take pride in being a very active Chartered Club
- Many new residents see our website and we can influence them to join our club
- **We can keep you updated on change of date and time of events**

Let's take a peek at our webpage together. To get to our webpage, this is what you do:

1. Log into the Sun City Texas Community Association page.
2. Click on Resident Login (orange bar)
3. Type in Username and Password (Enter)
4. Find Clubs and Neighborhoods at the top of the SCTXCA page (Double Click)
5. Find "Chartered Clubs" on the left-hand side of the page (it is listed like a table of contents in a book) (Double Click)
6. You'll find the Charter Club listings in alphabetical order; Bocce is listed as number 6 (Double Click)
7. You are now looking at the Bocce Website!



Click on one of the dates and up pops another page (you may have to scroll down the page just a bit) and you will see an



explanation of that event.

The next heading is MEMBERSHIP. This site explains how much our dues are and what it takes to become a member of the Bocce Club.

BOCCE USAGE AND REGULATIONS is detailed information about our Chartered Club owned by SCTXCA. It gives specifics on who may use the courts and rules for managing the courts. It even includes a paragraph on safety and conflict resolution.

Don Webb keeps up with our PHOTO GALLERY. This year he has included *Videos* as one of the sub-topics under PHOTO GALLERY. You'll enjoy seeing all the photos and videos of all the events throughout the year. You might even catch a




photo of yourself!

If you want to know who is in our Club, you can click on CLUB MEMBERSHIP LISTING. Some of the members have photos so that you can put a face to the name. The CA maintains this site and keeps it updated.




The Bocce Board meets four times a year. Everything we do and every decision we make is for the public and is recorded in the 2017 BOCCE BOARD MINUTES.

We just added this site, BOCCE MERCHANDISE. Just click on this heading and you can check- out information on how to order a Bocce Name Badge or a Bocce T-Shirt.

We are also adding a new heading, NEW MEMBER CORNER. This site is written by Sal Caravello, the New Member Trainer. He will keep the New Members informed on:

- How to join the Bocce Club
- When can I play bocce
- Using the Website
- Monthly Calendar
- Court Markings
- Court Etiquette
- Object of the game
- Sun City Rules

Notice the **red clip** with an exclamation mark under the banner picture on the right-hand side of the page. This demands your attention. Here I post important dates and times of upcoming events. The example on the website is Save the date for the “Night in Naples”. If you double click on these words, more information about the “Night in Naples” will appear.



Under the Notice Sign, you will see a snap shot and short paragraph defining Bocce. At the bottom of this paragraph you will see the words *Find Out More* with a pointing arrow. This means there is more information about this topic and just click on *Find Out More* will lead you to more information about Bocce.

Look to the far right of and you will notice UPCOMING EVENTS for that week or following week are posted. Click on one of the icons and more information about the event will appear.

At the bottom of the webpage is another **clip or tab** that is **blue**. This **tab** is used to communicate important messaging to our members such as the General Membership Meeting. These can be scheduled to come on and off the home page.

I know that most of you know how to use our Bocce Website and this article is redundant. For those of you who are new to websites, I hope this article is helpful.

Janet Platteborze will be taking over as Webmaster in January and I know she will welcome suggestions and ideas to help make the Bocce Website better and more useful.
