FIVE MORE MINUTES WITH STEVE MELLINGER-BOCCE PRESIDENT

Bocce is primarily played for the fun-of-it. Playing Bocce is fun but, as with any physical activity, you need to exercise good judgement. As your Bocce Safety Officer, I would like to remind you of a few Safety Guidelines:

- Wear quality Court shoes, no sandals or open toe footwear.
- For clothing, choose synthetic, wool or silk, materials that wick moisture and dry quickly. There is a huge variety of choices available in outdoor clothing.
- Wear wide brim hats for hot weather, or ball caps. They both help keep the sun out of your eyes.
- Use sunscreen to protect your skin.
- Keep hydrated.
- Remember that this a "game for fun and relaxation." Know your limits.
- There is a First Aid Kit located in the shed on the left-hand side of the door.
- If you witness a serious injury, there are forms behind the first aid kits that need to be filled out and returned to the Desk Monitor in the Texas Social Center.
- If you must call 911 for an emergency, note the location is 1410 Sun City Boulevard, Georgetown, Texas.
- No glass containers allowed on the Courts!
- No smoking permitted around the Courts!
- No animals allowed on the Court surface!

BOCCE TIPS Volume 3

Question from Volume 2: Why don't we have lines marking the players box and midcourt, so it is easier to see?

Well, wait no longer, court one will be done shortly as soon as the weather cooperates. It will have two player boxes and a center court line. Player box means just that, you cannot stand beyond that line and roll the bocce ball. When the courts are resurfaced or even before all courts will be marked. It will look great and just right for International play.

Question: Do you know what they call getting all the points in a play i.e. four points? It is a standard reference in most sport play. It is called a "**Hat Trick**". Meaning he pulled it out of his hat. Not what you think, right!

Question: Who starts play? Well, in most cases it is the toss of a coin. The winner gets to toss the Pallino first and select the Bocce ball color of their choosing. This can and will make a big difference as the game progresses.

Question: Where do I roll the Pallino? Now remember how the game is played. We are to get as close to the Pallino as we possibly can. Putting ourselves in the better position than our opponent. To do this you must know your opponent and we will talk about that later on. For the sake of this issue we want to simply protect the Pallino. So, rolling the Pallino first is a major advantage, because you get to roll it the distance and position on the court you are most comfortable. The key here is where you are most comfortable, not your opponent's strength area.

Why? Because since you rolled the Pallino you get to roll the first Bocce ball. That first Bocce ball roll establishes the distance between the Pallino and the Bocce ball for all points going forward in the play.

Question for the next issue. How do I roll the Bocce ball?

A 33-year Partnership, by Anna Ruth

In honor of Valentine's Day, I asked Anna if she would share her love story of her late husband, Don. This is her real-life love story that will touch your heart. Sherry Nogle

Don and I met in the early 80's at work in Houston, Texas. One day I was walking down the aisle, headed to the lounge for a coffee break, when I noticed this well-built man in front of me and I thought, "My what wide shoulders this man has and besides that, he walks like Robert Mitcham." After a few coffee breaks together, a 33-year partnership began. I guess it's true that opposites attract because he was soft spoken and a little introverted. I was loud and a little extroverted. Throughout the years we melted into a little of each.

Within two years, we found ourselves in Las Vegas, where we loved the proximity to neighboring states (California, Utah and Arizona). We traveled and enjoyed discovering sights, landmarks, parks and museums in each state.

We acquired our first little love, Soo Soo, a Shih Tsu. Don had his first heart attack while in Las Vegas. We also lost Soo Soo in 2000. To take Soo Soo place, we acquired two new Shih Tsu's, Wookie and Coco.

We spent 18 years in Las Vegas, but my heart was in Texas where my children lived. So, in late 2003, we moved to Sun City, Texas. It was the best move we ever made! Don enjoyed driving for COPS and together we enjoyed our senior bowling. We loved cooking together. His specialty was tacos and seafood gumbo. In fact, our neighborhood called him "The Taco Man".

Tragically, Don suffered another heart attack and then a stroke. He came through without too much damage, but he was diagnosed with COPD. The oxygen tank restricted his active life. He had to give up a lot of the activities that both of us had always enjoyed. We mourned the losses of Wookie in 2010 and Coco in December 2016. With all the struggles, tears, illnesses, and changes, our love story continued to form.

I joined the Bocce Club where I met some wonderful people. My biggest regret is that I didn't join it sooner.

On November 10, 2017, my life changed forever. Don had his tragic auto accident. Ten awful days spent in the Critical Care Unit in limbo. On November 20, I made the most agonizing decision I ever had to make, to take him off the ventilator. A decision only God should make. I watched as he passed away peacefully and out of pain. A memory that will haunt me forever. The void is there day in and day out. I now realize how seriously his COPD limited him, and I feel guilty for expecting more than he was able to give. I am trying to forgive myself.

The hours spent playing bocce have helped to fill the time and ease the memory. Now, I try to think of only good memories. (I still have a ghost in the house though). I want to stay in this wonderful community where I have great neighbors and of course enjoy my bocce outings and friends. You never know what's around the corner and when something might happen to your loved one.

PS. Don was an ordinary man, who wanted no funeral and no service, but I wanted something to commemorate him by, so he will be remembered by having a brick at the Veteran's Memorial here in Sun City.
