Thanks to all our volunteers, we have filled all our slots for Junior Camp. Junior Camp is a two-week Camp here in Sun City. The residents can have their grandchildren spend two weeks doing an assortment of activities sponsored by different clubs. The Bocce Club will host the kids on Tuesday, June 12th and Tuesday, June 19th. We try and teach the kids the basic Sun City rules: (1) Bocce consists of two teams taking turns rolling. (2) Closest ball(s) to the pallino score point(s) (no rulers on the courts). (3) Remind the kids that the back wall is live, but they do not have to throw hard. (4) You will oversee judging the balls and calling points. Our goal is for the kids to have *FUN!* You will experience lots of energetic young grandkids eager to play *Bocce!*

We'll have TWO sessions with four different age groups per day. *Lil Doggies*: Ages 7-8; *Pardners*: 8-9; *Wranglers*: 9-10 and *Longhorns*: Ages 10-11.





BOCCE TIPS Volume 7

New Training Starts: New Comers Training starts on Friday, August 17th, and November 16th, these are three day sessions for new residence, if any members are interested in participating please come join us, it fun and enjoyable, I promise.....



Question from Volume 7: Is it legal to cross the center line?

YES. There are two main reasons to cross and they both require the same first step, ask the captain of the opposing team for permission. If you are on a four-player team, with two of your teammates playing from the opposite end of the court, it is common to meet at the center line to discuss strategy. What if you would like to take a closer look at the way the balls and pallino are situated? Always ask the captain. Although it is a rule that you must get the opposing captains permission to cross over the line, it is almost seems like no more than a courtesy to ask permission.

A Historical Look: In 1576, the Republic of Venice publicly condemned the sport, punishing those who played with fines and imprisonment. Perhaps most grave was the condemnation by the Catholic Church which deterred the laity and officially probated clergyman from playing the game by proclaiming Bocce as a means of gambling. Contrary to the rest of Europe, the great game of balls thrived in Great Britain. Such nobility as Queen Elizabeth I and Sir Francis Drake were avid fans. According to legend, Sir Frances Drake refused to set out to defend England against the Spanish Armada until he finished a game. He proclaimed, "First we finish the game, then we'll deal with the Armada". Bocce frequently lost and gained popularity throughout the ages. It was Giuseppe Garibaldi, who while unifying and nationalizing Italy popularized the sport as it is known today. In 1896 during a resurgence of popularity, the first Bocce Olympiad was held in Athens, Greece. Bocce has been a part of international sports ever since.






SUNSHINE & RAINBOWS
