FROM FOUR TO EIGHT

When I joined the Bocce Club in 2004, we only had four courts. The "old-timers" were regular players that came almost every day of the week. There were so many wanting to play that we had to wait for our turn to get on the courts. Also, there was no playing at 1 p.m. during the cold weather; you came at 8 a.m. dressed in gloves, a hat, and very warm jacket! The 1 p.m. starting time came a few years later. As time progressed, I looked forward to our Breakfast at the Court and the yearly hot dog lunch. The Christmas dinner rounded out the three or four social events for the year. Eventually, I was nominated for and elected to the board. I served many years with several different presidents (Dick Denny, Paul Chevalier, Bill Templeman, and Russ Ruff). Each new group of board members had ideas about how to best serve the needs of the club.

One thing that was common was our fund raising. It included several garage sales which required many volunteers and many hours of work. At one time the City market had a rebate system that we also tried. Many hours were devoted to collecting receipts, verifying the amounts, and calculating the percentage of payment that the club received. Bake sales at the theater provided another source of revenue. Of course, it was mostly the devoted volunteers that baked and baked each time so the club would have a profit. (Bob Lull always thought it would be cheaper to give a monetary donation!)

As the years passed, many changes happened. A shed was added to our property and a BBQ was installed. Electricity was hooked up in the shed. Lights on the courts were requested and denied. New awnings were requested and denied. The club helped develop the landscaped area between the bocce courts and the horseshoe courts. Soon the original courts were expended to 6 courts plus two slabs for future development. To celebrate the completion of these new courts, Pulte held a grand reopening event in June of 2009.

In anticipation of the courts' availability, league play was introduced in May of 2009. The first league had 12 players with 10 subs and it lasted for 8 weeks. Bob Lull wrote the original Bocce League Rules for Sun City. He oversaw that first league and he kept the statistics for the session. It became apparent that computer technology would be more effective in recording the wins and losses. That's when I become more involved with the leagues. I designed a new spreadsheet format that continued to be used through 2016. In January of each year a schedule was presented to the board for approval.

During the development of league play, leagues were held on different days of the week and at different times. In the early years, all leagues were scheduled for 8 weeks with no extension for any reason. In January of 2010 the league had grown to 20 regular players and many subs. Each year the number of individual participants increased. Most leagues used Sun City Rules; however, Adapted Bocce Federation Rules were used for 2 of the 5 scheduled leagues per year.

As the league play continued to grow, social leagues were introduced in 2013. Partners or team scores were recorded with the intent that this would be a "fun" format for many players. A survey of the members at that time indicated that a "fun" event was very desirable. Thus, the concept of One Day Events was introduced. The One Day Events were designed to increase Bocce participation. The idea grew in popularity and the number of events per year increased. In the meantime, the length of the league was shortened to 5 or 6 weeks depending on the calendar.

The original rules stated that prize of the league champion would be congratulations and admiration of his/her fellow competitors. In 2010, the club president thought that a certificate should be awarded to the individual league winners. At the Christmas Dinner, certificates were presented to the winners. The tradition continued through 2016.

During all these developments Bob Lull and I maintained the schedules and the results. In the last few years, I received assistance with statistics from Russ Ruff. A very active social committee changed the schedule in 2016. Many of the social events included food which attracted more people. These changes resulted in increased participation. The total membership numbers continue to increase as the number of events increases. Bocce has developed a plan to accommodate the increase in activity. A balance between social events and league play is the goal. When the two new courts are available for use, 8 courts will be used for activities. More opportunities will exist and bocce will continue to grow. Go Bocce!

If you made it to this point, you have read about the many volunteers that have shaped the club into what it is today. I enjoyed my many years on the board and I hope that my contributions made a difference. Remember to support the board and its activities. Volunteer when you can help!!!
