#### A few words from Ron Pontiff – President


The results of the Bocce Membership Survey are in. Forty-Four (44) members responded to the survey. This represented about 15% of the membership, at the time of the survey.

One of the intents of the survey was to determine what women and men each want from the club. Twenty-one (21) women and Twenty-three (23) men responded. Survey demographics are as follows:

Thirty (30) of the Forty-four respondents participate in open play. Five (5) of the non-participants felt the time was not convenient or had scheduling conflicts. Three (3) did not feel welcomed by the participants. Injuries, lack of experience and preference for other Bocce activities accounted for four (4) reasons for non-participation.

All but 1 responder participates in other club sponsored events. She does participate in Open Play. The majority of the responders participate in two to five events per month (16 women and 10 men) The following chart breaks out the types of events:



As stated earlier in this article, the purpose of the survey was to determine the desires of its membership. Membership desires can be viewed as follows:

The good news is that the Board has implemented or is working on the most desired; Non-competitive Pairs, Non-competitive Ladies and Neighborhood

Challenges. Competitive Pairs, Competitive Ladies and Competitive Men are being evaluated.

Question 12 asked "what you like about the club". Twenty responses liked the friendly helpful people; ten just love to play bocce; nine loved the social events and non-competitive leagues; 5 liked the competitive leagues; 2, beautiful environment and one loved playing with the grandkids.

The last question asked the members about changes they would like to see in 2020. Ten responses said do nothing different. Three wanted more participation from the club membership. Two felt there were too many leagues, wanted more non-competitive pairs and "fun" stuff.

There were also questions about facility improvements like lighting, benches spectator benches at court 8, shed improvements. The Board is working on facility improvements, including some of those mentioned. We will update the membership periodically through-out the year.

Below are responses to specific concerns:

Concern 1: I like individual scoring instead of team scoring. **Response:** Individual scoring has been experimented with over the last two years. Overall feedback that I have received is that the legacy scoring method is preferred.

Concern 2: I would like to have a more inviting and inclusive attitude in the club that openly works with new and relatively inexperienced members. **Response:** The board is actively trying to address this; a beginner's open league, Come Back to Bocce open play, couples fun league and a Ladies fun league are all on the calendar to specifically address this issue.

Concern 3: Add lighting to courts for evening play. Kiss or no kiss - final decision. **Response:** A lighting request is being prepared for submittal to the CA. Two points for kisses are allowed in Sun City Rules of Play. Kisses do not receive 2 two points in International Rules of Play.

Concern 4: More of a united club instead of a divided club. A united club would provide for more participation in all events. **Response:** I am not sure how the club is divided. If you are talking about having 2 rules-of-play, I don't consider this as a dividing point. It simply provides an option for the players. I think the survey

results support my opinion. If the division you are talking about is something else, I would be glad to hear from you, Ronald Pontiff, <a href="mailto:rpontiff@sbcglobal.net">rpontiff@sbcglobal.net</a>.

Concern 4: I reserved the courts for our neighborhood & toward the end of last year I could not get anyone to answer my request for reservations with the reservation form online. I am going to try again today. Also, on the Bocce Ball Calendar why can't all of the reservations show up besides just Bocce Ball activities? **Response;** I believe both issues have been corrected for this year, if not please let me know.

Concern 5: Perhaps start the leagues in February vs. January so the weather might be consistently warmer. **Response;** This was done at the request of the members who normally play in leagues, to get one more league in for the year. Our next series of leagues start early March.

Concern 6: Since many new members who like to play as couples have one person still working it would be nice to have a Saturday afternoon couples play. **Response:** The Board is talking about this
