Jack presents the The Attraction of Moths

People who spend time outdoors have surely noticed butterflies, especially in Texas where there are over 400 species, including Monarchs that migrate by the thousands in spring and fall. Butterflies are not only strikingly beautiful, but are also important pollinators. But even people with keen natural interests often overlook a related winged insect – the moth. This presentation hopes to illustrate the beauty and variety of Texas moths so that more people will be interested in these often-colorful night flyers. Seeing them can be as easy as turning on a light!

Jack Cochran is a retired analytical chemist with a lifelong love of the natural world. His initial interest was viewing birds, but he expanded to butterflies and dragonflies, and finally plunged into the challenge of observing and trying to identify moths. Jack's other hobbies include wildlife photography and citizen science through iNaturalist. He is a Texas Master Naturalist in the Good Water Chapter.
