Brad had done such a beautiful job explaining the concepts of circulate and trade for some of my previous newsletters. I thought I'd add *trade* to this newsletter since our students are learning these concepts now.

"All trades are essentially the same yet feel different from one another. At it's core a Trade says that one simply walks forward in a semi-circle to exchange places with another dancer. In saying semi-circle, the call is telling you that you will end up facing the opposite direction. This call is simplest when those directed trade are facing opposite directions and connected by hand to one another. They simply rotate about the joined hands to exchange places. It is when they are not connected or are facing the same direction that dancers become confused. But if they take that split second to locate the person with whom they are directed to TRADE and then simply walk forward to take that person's place. A TRADE will always happen next to you as opposed to someone in front of you. In other words, look to either side to locate the person you are to TRADE with.

I encourage every one of you to look at the TRADE calls on your favorite medium. Tamination and Saddlebrook squares should both be very informative. Pick a dancer or individual and follow that person through the call. Try to predict the ending point. Keep practicing this until you can confidently know that you will predict the finish for each position in the illustration."
