



PHOTOGRAPHER OF THE MONTH

Learning the mechanics of one's camera is certainly an important facet of photography, comparatively easy to learn but somewhat harder to implement. More elusive is the artistic aspect. I recall my Art 101 ("bone-head" art for non-art majors) in college. I remember staring at a blank piece of paper every week and racking my brain deciding how to fill it – and make it sufficiently artistic to show in class and survive the professor's criticism. Now, years later, there is another opportunity to develop that difficult artistic aspect in the photographic medium, I.e., the photography club. Once you learn to objectively evaluate the criticisms (that's a good word) of others, those offerings become your tools to fashion a better picture.

Now in retirement I discovered I wanted to expand my photographic knowledge and scope beyond Art 101. With that in mind, I recall our club's motto: "Become the photographer you want to be." I think that's my favorite mission statement of all time. Notice that doesn't say that everyone should strive to win national PSA contests. It says: decide what you want to do with your photography and then get better at it. I'm still doing that.



The club will be exhibiting at the library from July 21, 2021 thru August 22, 2021. The exhibit will be on the second level in the Hall Gallery and we will be accepting 30 photographs for this exhibit.

The theme for our exhibit is "The Eyes Have It". The photographs we present in this exhibit will either have eyes or an eye as the subject of the photograph, or be a prominent feature of the subject. The following is a quote from our proposal:

In any photograph of a person or animal, if the eyes are present in the picture, they are of utmost importance to the photographer and every effort is made to get the eyes in sharp focus. Our exhibit will display our photographers' artistic presentation on a print medium of people, wildlife and pets where the eyes draw our attention and take us into the entire photograph. This concept allows for a wide range of subjects with the eyes being the unifying theme.

In addition, any inanimate objects having an eye or eyes as a prominent feature would also qualify for this exhibit.

Many of you already have a favorite photo that meets the requirements of this exhibit. For those of you who don't, you have eight months before our April 2021 registration to get out there and find that shot that will have the viewer saying, "Wow, the eyes have it."



PSA is Restructuring their Education Department

The following courses are temporarily suspended while PSA updates and improves them: Portfolios, Image Analysis and Creating Competitive Images. The education department continues to offer Portraits, Still Life Photography and Light Painting the Still Life. If you're interested in any of these courses, please sign up at https://psa-photo.org/index.php?education-online-courses.

Re-write and Redesign of the Image Analysis course

The Image Analysis course is being restructured into two separate courses: Image Evaluation and Image Critique. Image Evaluation is designed to teach the photographer how to look at the elements within an image with a focus on both understanding the elements that make a good photograph and being able to identify these elements within an image. The course is designed to help the student evaluate his/her own work within the framework of PSA-recognized International exhibitions and the camera club environment. Students who wish to pursue becoming a judge of images should sign up for the Image Critique course. This course will emphasize how to document a review of other photographers' images based on the globally accepted elements of a good photograph. It will look at judging language, bias, rules, etc. At the completion of this course the student should have the basic skills necessary to evaluate other photographers' work.

Congratulations to Sue Puetz and Dee Darius Sams who have been asked to contribute to the development of these courses and to participate on the team to trial the courses. At the completion of the trial and at the time the courses are rolled out, both Sue and Dee Darius have been asked to be instructors to teach these courses.






