The Club's Board conducted a member survey In February 2022. Your answers indicated a need for classes, groups and events related to beginning photography, using an iPhone and nature and travel photography.

From there, the board formed an Education Committee that developed 20 classes led by vetted instructors and attended by 188 members. Between now and the end of the year, we plan to offer 14 or more classes, seven of which will be brand new.

In addition to education, the club has offered field trips for a variety of photographic genres, added the Street Photography Special Interest Group (SIG) and combined the Nature and Bird SIGs into the Outdoor SIG. Additionally, the club has expanded its member exhibits to include St. Davids Hospital and the Georgetown Library, both of which will have new exhibits in the coming months.

So. Why am I telling you this?

Most of this has been done by your Board of Directors. They've spent untold hours developing the curriculum to help improve your photographic skills and inspire your creative minds at our general meetings. They've given their time and energy for the benefit of all club members, and they could use some help. The Competition SIG is evolving into Photo Discussion SIG

Our surveys have shown that twice as many of our members are interested in photo evaluations and critiques than in competitions. As a result, we are dissolving the Competition SIG and replacing it with a Photo Discussion SIG.

Here's how we envision it will work: Members who want to participate may upload two digital images to Dropbox by the end of the day on the first day of the month. (The link to upload the files will be available on the club's website. Click on Special Interest Groups and then Photo Discussion SIG.) A certified PSA judge will provide written evaluations of the photo prior to the SIG meeting. (This is a service provided by the PSA. Judges may be from anywhere in the world.) We will provide everyone who uploads a photo with the judge's comments prior to the SIG meeting which is scheduled for the third Wednesday of the month.

At our meetings, we will show the submitted images. All photographers will be invited to comment on the judge's remarks about their photos. Others attending will have the opportunity to comment as well. We want these discussions to be positive with the goal of helping our members make better photos.

This new SIG will begin in September, so upload your photos by September 1 and attend our SIG meeting at 10:00 AM on September 20 in Game rooms 1 & 2.




