FROM OUR TREASURER



LEAGUES & TRAINING

WINTER LEAGUES

Winter Leagues will run 8 weeks from January 15 through March 5 starting at 1:00. Format is round robin - 3 games to 11 points.

DIVISION

Beginners (2.0 to 2.9) Mondays

Intermediate (3.0 to 3.4) Wednesdays

Advanced (3.5 and above) Fridays

These will be drop-in leagues. All you need to do is show up and sign up (first come, first served). About 30 minutes before start time, a sign up sheet will be available. After all players (up to a total of 24) have signed up, there is a random draw for court assignments. You must be a Club member to participate in the leagues. An individual can only play in one league per week.

INTRO TO PICKLEBALL CLASSES

Classes are scheduled twice a month on Saturdays from 3:00 to 5:00. Classes are currently scheduled for January 13 and 27. You do not need to be a Club member for this class. Equipment is provided. **YOU NEED TO REGISTER IN ADVANCE FOR THE CLASS** with Peg O'Toole (see email address below).

BEGINNER MENTORING

A new session of Beginner Mentoring Classes will be held in February. Classes are from 1:00 to 3:00 on Saturdays, February 3, 10, 17 and 24. Participants need to commit to all four weeks.

BEGINNER SKILLS AND DRILLS

Beginner Skills and Drills will start on Thursday, February 8 and continue for four weeks. Classes are from 1:00 to 2:00. You do not need to sign up in advance for this training.

INTERMEDIATE TRAINING

Next classes are scheduled from 1/8 through 1/14/18. Class size is limited to 12 participants. There are a couple openings available for these Intermediate Training classes.

For all training and leagues, except the Introduction to Pickleball Class, you need to be a member of the Pickleball club.


Travel spots for Nancy and Clark are either going back to Ohio to visit family and friends (they lived there for 60 years) before moving to Texas, or going to Europe.

APPROVED PICKLE-BALLS

I sincerely hope that you all had a very joyous holiday season and are looking forward to a great pickleball year in 2018!

The most asked question I've received lately has been, 'Chuck, what's the new approved ball?' That's kind of a trick question because there are currently 17 USAPA approved pickleballs. But that really only matters for USAPA sanctioned tournaments. Here at Sun City, we can play with any ball we choose...approved or not. It just happens that the balls that most of us like to play with are on this approved list:

List of Approved Pickleballs

While I'm on the subject about pickleballs, I met the Onix Pickleball rep at the USAPA Nationals and was offered the opportunity to buy their new Onix Fuse pickleball and a very good price. I was putting together an order for our club and members (335 balls so far) when I received the following message on the day I planning to place the order:

"ONIX Pickleball is committed to the highest standards for our products. Since receiving our first production run of the FUSE Outdoor Ball, we've been testing it internally and have discovered that some of the balls are not meeting our quality standards. Because of this, we are going to delay the launch of the ONIX Fuse Outdoor ball. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. However, we want to ensure the product's integrity to ensure the best experience for our customers.

We will update you with a new launch date as soon as we have more details."

Obviously, I will not be ordering balls until they get their issues fixed. I'll keep track of everyone's ball request but my intention is to phone my contact and request that he send me sample balls for all of us to test. Then, if we're satisfied I'll place the order for those of you that still want Fuse balls.

Meanwhile, I think I'm close to getting "The Pickleball Blues".




A PICKLEBALL STORY

Whenever the discussion about playing with other level players arises it usually heats up pretty fast, so I would like to mention something that happened to me years ago.

I was drilling overheads with my coach (Dad) when 2 boys, probably 6 or 7 years old, came on the court and asked if they could join in. I knew my dad would say yes; he always does. One boy had glasses that kept falling off and if I remember right the other one had one shoe that was built up so he could walk better. They stayed for about 45 minutes and as usual my dad had us lose a game to them. When they walked over to their bikes one of them stopped and gave me a high five.



On the drive home I mentioned to my dad that I thought I didn't get a good practice in and I felt cheated. He told me, "Today you practiced compassion; other days you practice hitting a yellow plastic ball. You tell me - which is more important?"

He said he was more proud of me for giving that boy a high five than if I had hit 100 overhead winners.

Now when I think I only have time to play with my "level" I remember the boy with the loose glasses and the boy with the thick shoe sole, and I find comfort in not taking the sport so seriously that I lose touch with what is really important.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We have added a FAQ section to our SCTPC website here - **Frequently Asked Questions**. This is a sampling of a few of the questions along with answers from your SCTPC board. Rules and regulations from our club, as well as the Community Association, which apply to these questions, are listed at the end of the FAQ on the website.

I don't like it when players skip over 2 or 3 paddles and put their paddles in together and then go out on the courts. That leaves those 2 or 3 paddles sitting there and we aren't getting to play as often or we get ignored and I end up going home.

This comment parrots at least a 1/3 of the club's membership based on the survey comments. It is a serious issue that the Board feels could be alleviated by some common courtesy and a little empathy. The club's court policies can be found under the "Paddle Rack System" on the website. Having said that, the Board would encourage all groups (of 4) to consider playing with others when there are paddles waiting to form a group. When there are players trying to get ready for a tournament, that typically means 2 players and they in turn could play 2 other players that are waiting.

The Board does NOT want to play "Enforcer" and there's no reason not to play with everyone.

Why is there a concrete wall on the new courts?

While it is true that there is a low concrete wall that exists along the north and west fenced part of the courts, these cement walls were not a part of the original drawings that members of our club helped design with Pulte. When this was brought to the CA Facilities and Pulte's management, we were told that they would see what could be done and get back in touch with the club. **this communication took place the first week of December 2017 and the club has not heard anything further at the time of this writing.

We need more lights; why can't we have them?

We don't know of anyone who would disagree with this comment. Unfortunately, when the club was finally able to get the CA to agree to fixing (and paying for) the lights on courts 5 and 6, the CA facilities manager told the club that there could not be any lights put onto courts 1-4 because of an agreement the CA had with the homeowners living directly across Sun City Blvd. As a side note, all of the new Queen Tract courts will have lights.

They asked "How did you do it? How did you attract a woman like this?"


He says, with a slight smile on his face, "Well, I did have to lie about my age, I admit."
