SPRING TOURNAMENT & BBQ

Our "Swing into Spring" Tournament & BBQ Dinner was held on Saturday, April 14th.

Round-robin play was scheduled for three divisions of players:

- 1. Novice 5 teams with 5-7 players per team, plus a coach for each team.
- 2. Intermediate 5 teams with 6-8 players per team.
- 3. Advanced 5 teams with 6-8 players per team.

A total of 111 players, plus 5 coaches signed up for the event. There was a registration cutoff date and all entries had to be received by that date. We did allow people who missed signing up to be added to a sub-wait-list. However very few players dropped out, so only a couple people needed to be added.

Although it was an extremely windy day for our spring tournament, we were able to get all 5 rounds of play completed. We did play 11-point games, starting at 9:00 am, with the last match over at 2:45 pm.

A lunch was served to an estimated 120 tournament players, coaches and volunteers by the Stacy Group, court-side. A BBQ Dinner was served to approximately 150 members and guests of SCTPC at the Cowan Creek Pavilion. Dinner was catered by Dickie's. LEAGUES & TRAINING

SPRING LEAGUES

Spring Leagues will run 8 weeks from April 30 through June 18 starting at 11:00. (Note the time change.) Format is round robin - 3 games to 11 points. We will have 4 doubles leagues based upon the Skill Levels that have been published in our **Ratings & Skill Level sheet**. Participants should join a league based upon their self-rated skill level or their USAPA rating. We ask that you only play in the league that matches your USAPA rating (if you have one) or your self-rating (if you don't have a rating from the USAPA). If in doubt, you should play in the lower league. Participants must be SCTPC members.

DIVISION	DAY
Novice (2.5)	Mondays (starting 4/30)
Low Intermediate (3.0)	Wednesdays (starting 5/2)
High Intermediate (3.5)	Thursdays (starting 5/3)
Advanced (4.0 and above)	Fridays (starting 5/4)

These will be <u>drop-in</u> leagues. All you need to do is show up and sign up (first come, first served). About 30 minutes before start time, a sign up sheet will be available. After all players (up to a total of 24) have signed up, there is a random draw for court assignments.
