VOLUNTEER OF THE MONTH

MARY PAYNE

Mary Payne is recognized for her contributions as USAPA certified referee, 4.0 rated player/partner and associate instructor for the Club's Intermediate Training Program. As the only nationally certified USAPA referee in Sun City, Mary provides a high level of professionalism to the conduct of club tournaments. She can be counted on to ensure that USAPA/IFP rules are followed impartially, fairly, and consistently for the matches she oversees. Additionally, she is source of expertise on the interpretation and clarification of rules for players and unrated volunteer referees.

Mary has been a mainstay for the Intermediate Training Program. Her role has evolved from volunteer referee for the end of program mini-tournament to associate instructor. As an experienced tournament player with a 4.0 USAPA rating, Mary can be counted on to demonstrate proper execution of pickleball strokes and strategies. She has helped teach the concepts of playing "smart pickleball" by conducting practice drills, evaluating player performance and providing feedback for individual improvement. She is always available to help in whatever capacity she is asked.

Lastly, Mary leads by example by being the consummate doubles partner. Among her attributes are integrity, open-mindedness, communication skills, focus and a sense of humor. While she knows winning is important, honesty is more important. She agrees on most strategies, but is willing to compromise on others. She's willing to speak up, and able to listen. She focuses on setting up and protecting her partner. And, she patiently puts up with the antics of her doubles partner. I know, because she's put up with me at numerous tournaments.

From Mary Payne:

I was born and raised in San Marcos. Later in years moved to Austin to work in the high tech industry. Through a recruiting company met a husband and wife couple who owned and ran a repair and calibration lab for test equipment, primarily for IBM. That was my first experience with office management, procurement, inventory control, work order control and customer service. I learned quickly to wear many hats and LOVED IT!

Stan and I met while working in Austin at Tandem Computers. We worked together (Stan in inventory control and me in procurement)

for 13 years before I left Tandem after 15 years. I was offered a position at a start-up company...where again I wore many hats. This was my calling! I worked for three start-up companies before retiring.

We moved to Sun City in 2004. We weren't sure if Sun City was going to be the right place for us because we were much younger than the average population but we fell in love with the wild life, amenities, and how friendly everyone was.

We, as many of you, had never heard of pickleball. Such a strange name, we weren't sure what to expect when we signed up for the introduction class, which was only \$5...what a bargain we thought to ourselves! After taking the introduction class, we were hooked on Pickleball, so we joined the club. That was in 2010.

I was club secretary for 2 years. And in 2012 I was asked (by Dave Larsen, who since has moved to Hawaii, and still plays pickleball) to help organize the first pickleball tournament the club had ever had. I was Tournament Director for 3 years. Fortunately for the club, Barb Patterson came on board as the new Tournament Director and has continued to make these events that everyone looks forward to.

In 2014 I played in my first tournament outside of the Sun City club tournaments. I played with Kathy Carr. When she suggested that we should play in the Texas Senior Games, "It will be fun" she said; and boy was it fun. That was my first

medal. I was hooked on tournaments and I have been playing tournaments ever since.

During rec play, if you're playing against a team with a higher-rated player and a lower-rated player, don't just hit to the lower-rated player to win points. Hit to the more advanced player too - it will help your game improve and make the more advanced player feel included.

RATINGS AND RULES

Well, the latest rating news from the USAPA is that we're now going to be using the 'legacy' ratings through the end of the year. This means

that, if you are playing in any sanctioned tournaments, you should log into **PickleballTournaments.com** and change your profile to reflect your legacy rating.

Many of the rules questions I receive come as a result of something that happened during a game. Last week a member asked what happens if the ball hits the black pole holding the net and then bounces fair into the court; is it in play or out of bounds when it hits the pole?

Great question...easy answer! The net post is considered a "permanent object" (Rule 3.A.23.) and Rule 4.M.4 and Rule 7.I. state that hitting a permanent object is a fault. Additionally, Rule 11.K. specifically states that the net posts are positioned out of bounds and a ball contacting the post is dead and a fault. Rule 11.K.1. states that a ball hitting the net and cable/rope between

the posts remains in play.

The second question I was asked was when one team/player reaches six points, is there a rule in recreation games about changing sides at six or is it up to the players? How many players should agree to changing sides?


Another good question. There is no rule covering this for recreational play. We often, as a matter of courtesy, change sides whenever wind or sun may be a factor giving an advantage to one side or the other. I usually ask the other team what they'd like to do if my team reaches six first...we're ahead and I want to be fair. If one team wants to switch and the other doesn't, suggest that the team ahead acquiesce to be fair. If it's three votes to one, the one should yield.

I don't know if it's this column but many more club members are asking me great rules questions, which makes finding topics to write about much easier. Thank you!


