Tournament season is here! I usually consider the Texas State Senior Games pickleball tournament in San Antonio to be the start of pickleball tournament season. That's obviously an arbitrary selection, but it is the one that that sticks in my mind. I think the reason for this is that it's the first tournament that so many of our

club members attended (2010: 19 members and 35 medals), and one that we continue to attend as a group.

This year marked the sixth year we've attended this event with about twenty of our members entered in the various events. Our Sun City pickleball club has garnered a very strong reputation throughout the region for having quality players who play well and make new pickleball friends easily.

This year also marks another exciting tournament milestone for our club. The National Senior Olympic Games are held every two years and

players attending must qualify by placing at a state tournament in the year prior to the games. We have over a dozen of our members who have qualified and are planning to compete at the games in Minneapolis, Minnesota, this coming July. Imagine that, Sun City pickleball players competing at the national level, wearing their "Sun City Pickleball, Georgetown, Texas" club shirts. Lastly, there a new tournament coming that you might like to hear about. Tim Dean, at the Cedar Park Recreation Center, has

News from Cedar Park Recreation Center

Beginning this Sunday, May 3rd, open pickleball play will be available every Sunday from 12 noon until 2 pm at the Cedar Park Recreation Center. Three courts will be available for play, and will be set up and ready to go before the Center opens for the day. This means you should be able to walk in when the doors are open and immediately begin play without waiting for the nets to be set up. The Center expects their player numbers to expand as working adults and school age children will be available during these times. Experienced players are advised to please have patience with new players and remember that all of us had to learn how to play the game at one point or another.



Please note that on the days Cedar Park conducts its introduction to pickleball and intermediate pickleball skills and strategy classes, they will only have one court available for open play. The dates of the classes that are currently scheduled include: May 17, June 14 and August 16. In the event that the classes don't meet the minimum number of students, all three courts will be available for open play.

Lastly, beginning on Monday, May 4th, the day pass fee for adults ages 55+ will increase to \$5 per day. It is suggested that you compare that cost with the number of days per month that you typically visit the recreation center against the price of a membership term of one month, three months or a year.

Who is Simon and When Is He Coming to Sun City?

How'd you like to have a practice partner who could place the ball exactly where it needed to be every time so you could master your dink? Wouldn't it be nice if you could count on that same partner to consistently shoot a lob at just the right height so you could improve your overhead shot? Well, that perfect partner is coming to Sun City and his name is Simon.

Simon is the only pickleball throwing machine on the market specifically designed for our sport Before he came along, pickleball players had to use machines retrofitted from tennis ball or baseball pitching machines. Because the size of a pickleball is different than a tennis, whiffle or baseball, these systems frequently jammed, and failed to replicate the ball return of an actual pickleball.

Simon has proven to be different. In February, three Simons were set up in Palm Creek, Arizona for demonstration during Paddle Day. They operated continuously for 4.5 hours and delivered more than 12,000 balls without any system failure.

Simon is completely portable. He runs on a 6 hour rechargeable sealed lead acid battery, so no electric cords are needed. He can feed balls up to speeds from 10 MPH (drives) using the fully adjustable speed dial. He can feed at a desired pace to accommodate player levels, and he is fully adjustable up to a ball every 2 seconds.

The angle at which the balls come from is also customizable simply by moving the machine to other places on the court and by turning it so the mouth faces other locations. Players can practice volleys, forehand and backhand ground strokes, overhead shots, drop shots, dinks and more.

Simon holds 70 balls in the chamber, but the included funnel attachment holds an additional 90 balls, bringing total ball capacity to 160 balls.

Simon is constructed in the USA and is made of heavy gauge steel. He stands 30 inches tall, 13 inches deep and 13 inches wide. He weighs 32 pounds and has a built-in carrying handle.

The manufacturer recommends using only Dura Indoor or Outdoor, Onix or TOP balls in the machine. The Jugs ball does not perform as consistently due to its slightly smaller size and softer composition.

Simon has been ordered and he is on his way to Sun City. When he arrives, volunteer members will be trained to serve as Equipment Managers who will, in turn, train members on the proper use of Simon and manage the issue process.

All Club members are invited to attend a demonstration of Simon on Wednesday, 27 May at 6:00 pm on pickleball Court 4. A free ice cream social will follow.

The Pickleball Club Board wants to make sure that Simon becomes and remains the ultimate training partner for Club members – that he never misses practice, always shows up on time, and consistently serves up the right practice balls.

To this end, Board members are working on procedures and a lesson plan that covers the security, storage, handling, scheduling, issue and return of Simon. These procedures will be shared with the membership, and a schedule of classes will be published within the next couple of weeks. Club members will be required to complete the class before reserving Simon. Sign up for the class will begin 27 May at the Simon Demonstration.

A Board decision was made early in the year to test Rally Scoring against the existing Club policy of limiting game play to 8 points, when all courts are occupied and more than 8 players are waiting. The purpose was to determine the better scoring system – one that would optimize available court space, while providing members with as much quality play time as possible.

Due to bad weather during the month of February and part of March, the start date for the test was delayed several times. The Club needed a positive weather report for 3 sequential days, after which an eblast would


