Key Factors in Hearing Aid Technology

- The hearing aid manufacturer, model, style, and features should be determined by your Audiologist based on your hearing loss and lifestyle needs
- Recommendations should be made after your consultation with choices available but ultimately it is your decision on the product
- The hearing aid is only one small part of your hearing rehabilitation journey
 - Aural Rehabilitation
 - Motivation
 - Support
 - Severity and duration of Hearing loss

GN Resound: Linx 3D



- Digital hearing aids with Bluetooth technology
- Identify more speech in noise and hear more sounds around you
- Control your hearing aids from your smartphone
- Stream sound directly from your iPhone







GN Resound: Linx 3D







- Fine-tune your hearing aids remotely
- Get updates without going to the clinic
- Rechargeable batteries with Zpower (no telecoil in rechargeable)

Oticon: Opn


- Listen to multiple speakers in noisy environments
- Traditional hearing aids isolate one speaker and suppress all others. Oticon Opn processing is so fast it can remove noise around you and at the same time provide you with access to the speakers around you.
- Rechargeable batteries (no telecoil in rechargeable yet)





Oticon: Opn





- Digital hearing aids with Bluetooth and INTERNET connected
 - If this than that network (IFTTT.com)
 - Want the lights to turn on automatically when you switch on your hearing aids?
 - Want to be notified in your hearing aids when someone's at the door?

Starkey: Muse/Halo/Soundlens



- Muse- Improves speech in difficult listening environments
- Halo- Direct to iPhone
- Soundlens- WIRELESS invisible in the canal (IIC)





- Speech and music processed uniquely
- Patient controlled settings
- Environment detection system uses artificial intelligence to classify multiple listening environments and adjust hearing aid automatically

Starkey: Muse/Halo/Soundlens





- Muse iQ rechargeable
 - 30 hours
 - Smallest rechargeable hearing aid
 - Charger is also a dryer
 - Can charge for 3 days without plugging into the wall
 - No battery door
 - Telecoil

Phonak: Belong



Audeo B Direct:

- Connects to ANY Bluetooth phone without adapters
- Uses hearing aid as microphone when talking on the phone
- Streams only phone calls (no music) and only to 1 ear



Virto B Titanium:

- Smallest custom hearing aid made from durable titanium
- Invisible in the canal (IIC)
- Avoids shell cracking
- Medical grade hypoallergenic material
- Not wireless



Phonak and Unitron Rechargeable



- Unitron Moxi-R:
 - Rechargeable
 - 19 hours
 - telecoil



- Audeo/Bolero B-R:
 - Rechargeable
 - No battery door
 - 24 hours on single charge
 - Charger is also dry box

WIDEX®

- Hear the full spectrum of sounds
- Hear soft sounds and make sure loud sounds not uncomfortable
- Direct connection to iPhone
- Rechargeable with telecoil
- Hearing aid updates through the phone

PSAPs

- Should I consider purchasing online?
- "We believe that you achieve the best possible results by consulting with a hearing professional in person, so we do not endorse retailers selling over the Internet"
- PSAPs are a great "First step" into the hearing aid world for patients with mild to moderate high frequency hearing loss who are having difficulty hearing in background noise

Hearing Aid Maintenance

Remove earwax

- It is important to remove earwax from your hearing aid to prevent temporary malfunction or permanent damage. When you purchase your hearing aids, you should receive cleaning tools including a soft brush and small picks or loops. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for cleaning your hearing aids. If you cannot remove all the earwax, your hearing professional can help.
- When you remove your hearing aids at night, wipe them with a dry soft cloth. Do not use water, alcohol swabs or cleaning solvents as they can break down or damage your hearing aids.

Don't drop your hearing aids

• Dropping your hearing aids on a hard surface can damage the instruments. When you're learning how to correctly place and remove your hearing aids, do it from a seated position with a towel or pillow on your lap.

Proper storage


- When not in use, keep your hearing aids away from heat and moisture and store them in a dry, cool place. Ask your hearing specialist about a dehumidifying box for storage. These boxes are designed to safely and effectively remove moisture that can corrode sensitive circuitry.
- Leave the battery door open to preserve battery power when not in use.
- Keep away from children and pets
 - Place the aid out of reach of children and pets. Hearing aids that are still switched on and lying around emit high pitched sounds that can irritate dogs. This has resulted in some aids getting eaten by pet dogs.
- While most new hearing aids today are designed for water resistance, don't wear your hearing aids:
 - In the shower or sauna
 - Swimming
 - When using a hair dryer
 - While applying hair spray or other types of spray on products. Apply hair products first, and then insert your hearing

Hearing Aid Maintenance

- Changing filters (wax guards, wax traps, Hear Clear, ProWax, etc)

 - Once a month or as needed
- Changing domes
 - Every 6 months if necessary



Domes



Important notice!

• The dome is made of a soft material. If the dome comes off in the ear canal, it will not cause any harm. If you can, carefully take it out. If necessary, let another person help you. Do not push the dome into the ear canal. Do not push the tube into the ear again before the dome is removed from the ear. If you have any doubts about how to proceed if the dome comes off, contact your hearing care professional.

Rechargeable batteries

Z POWER

- 19 hours/day
- 1 year life
- 1 year warranty
- \$25/battery plus shipping each
- \$300 for charger
- Send battery and charger back for repair when having issues
- Can use traditional batteries

RECHARGEABLE (Phonak and Starkey)

- 24-30 hours/day
- 4 year life
- 3 year warranty
- \$200-\$300 to replace out of warranty
- Replaced by manufacturer if issues while under warranty
- No battery door for traditional batteries

Regular Visits to Your Audiologist


- Every 6 months at least!
 - Clean aids
 - Replace parts
 - Suction and dry hearing aids
 - Changed tubes/receivers
 - Annual audiograms
 - Update hearing aid firmware
 - Adjust settings depending on hearing changes

Aural Rehabilitation

- Patient satisfaction starts with patient education.
 - 1. Appropriate hearing aid expectations
 - 2. Importance of family member involvement
 - 3. Successful communication strategies



Aural Rehabilitation

- clEAR...Ear Train Your Brain
- clEAR Auditory Brain Training Games are fun and easy to use and can be played at home on the website
- Can train using the voice of a family member or friend
- Proven to be effective:
 - Increases active participation in social situations
 - Reduces stress levels during conversations
 - Improves confidence in noisy environments

When to Start Rehabilitation

- You have new hearing aids:
 - Rehabilitation compliments the benefits you receive from using new hearing aids and helps reach listening goals faster
- You're not ready for hearing aids
 - Rehabilitation can be the first step in the treatment process
- You already use hearing aids, but still feel you are missing out on conversations
 - Often people have great hearing aids but still need an organized way to learn new listening skills
