

What is WHO and what do we do?

What is WHO – WHO is a Sun City Community Association (CA) Charter Club of individuals with a passion and purpose for caring, sharing and serving the community. Its mission is to support existing charitable organizations (within Williamson County) with time (volunteering), donations and assistance (supporting nonprofits events/fundraisers) while fostering camaraderie, fellowship and inclusion.

Charter Clubs for Sun City – this is the policy that the CA enforces to initiate like-minded people to get together, maintain a uniform operation and coordination of all indoor and outdoor activities per the requirements of state and federal laws for community associations. Each Charter Club is required to provide a set of by-laws that are approved by the Charter Club Committee and submitted to the CA Board of Directors to ensure that the appropriate state and federal laws are not violated. WHO funds are managed by the CA and WHO must abide by their accounting practices.

WHO's Bi-Laws state that we will donate and distribute all dues and monetary donations to Williamson County nonprofits. The bi-laws are posted on the WHO website.

Promote volunteering – how does WHO promote this effort?

1. Scheduling nonprofit speakers at each meeting.
 - a. The Program Committee recommends speakers, and the WHO Board approves the list.
2. The WHO Vice President initiates field trips to nonprofit sites.
 - a. Field trips are normally before or after a nonprofit speaks.
 - b. The field trip helps members to see firsthand where and how the nonprofits operate.
 - c. In compliance with the WHO Board and Program Committee, initiate a donation drive for the speakers' nonprofit. For example: children books, toiletries, towels/blankets for animals, etc.
3. The Outreach table is available at each general meeting. The Outreach director has information about nonprofits in WILCO and how WHO members can get involved or volunteer.
4. Any WHO member can identify outreach activities and present it to the President and Vice President for approval.

5. The WHO Red Apron ladies (any WHO member who wants to volunteer) volunteer to serve at any third-party fundraiser that WHO promotes.

How does WHO get money? How do we raise money? How do we donate it?

1. WHO members are required to pay an annual club dues of \$10.
2. WHO members are encouraged to pay an additional \$10 at each meeting. **This, of course, is optional.**
3. The WHO Program Committee will sometimes vote to promote a specific WILCO nonprofit in need of assistance. In the past, WHO has had bake sales, crafts show and produced a cookbook.
4. Third Party Fundraisers-WHO members volunteer to work with a WILCO nonprofit organization to raise money for the organization and **staff** members from the organization collect all money raised. The money raised is not collected in the WHO account. Examples include a silent auction (members donated items to sell), Sock Hop Dance, Car Show, Craft and Bake sale. (see further explanation below).
5. How do we donate?
 - a. Each nonprofit speaker receives \$500 - \$750. This amount is recommended by the Program Committee, approved by the WHO board and voted on by the WHO membership at each general meeting.
 - b. The Program Committee will recommend donating to any approved WILCO nonprofit that is in need. The amount is based on the total of membership contributions in the WHO treasury. This type of donation can occur at any time of the year and is referred to as a "Give Away". The WHO board will approve, and the general membership will vote to approve. The goal is to donate membership contributions in the WHO treasury by the end of each year.

Third party fundraising – what is it?

1. Third party fundraising is where a third party or organization like WHO has an event to raise money for the nonprofit. WHO members will form committees that will organize the event, deciding on the type of event, venue, catering, and décor. All funds raised go directly to the nonprofit not into WHO treasury.

2. WHO has one third party fundraiser annually; Opportunities Meals-on-Wheels, that was initiated by the WHO charter members and collaborated with St. David's Hospital system. The WHO Program Committee will select one nonprofit every other year that WHO will organize a fundraiser with.

Outreach Program

Outreach Program is activities that we do for the community. WHO has an Outreach director and an outreach table at each general meeting. Here you can discover information about the WILCO nonprofits and get instructional information from the WHO Outreach Director about volunteering and donations.
