

Operation Liberty Hill keeps Wilco fed, clothed

Women Helping Others members were visited by Operation Liberty Hill Program Director Regina O'Brien and founder Susan Baker during the group's March meeting.

The duo told the nonprofit's story and shared information with WHO about services and opportunities to help the community in western Williamson County.

In 2008, the Liberty Hill Community Food Bank was based out of a local church, offering food once a month to 45 families in Liberty Hill ISD. It was from this service that Operation Liberty Hill evolved.

As word got around that help was available, their operations expanded and moved into a small house. They also began accepting clothing donations and held quarterly yard sales to buy food

for the pantry.

Demand had them bursting at the seams. The need for more space spurred Operation Liberty Hill to move to its current loca-

tion in 2015, and allowed them to open their Thrift Store.

Wilco Master Gardeners started a community garden to provide fresh produce to the food pantry. Food drives and partnerships with Central Texas Food Bank and local grocery stores enabled Operation Liberty Hill to continue meeting the needs of clients in their service area of Liberty Hill ISD, Leander, Bertram and Briggs. Sales from their Thrift Store helped stock food pantry shelves and provide free clothing, shoes and other household items.

support. Because of these faith based ladies and their staff of volunteers, so many needy people are helped in different ways.
