How does WHO raise so much money? A majority of the money is the result of third-party fundraisers and product drives.

A third-party fundraiser is where WHO takes responsibility for the fundraising task while collaborating with the assigned nonprofit. All funds raised at an event or events go directly into the nonprofit treasury. However, these organizations graciously give credit to WHO for the total donated. For example, WHO partnered with Hounds for Heroes to sponsor a car show in Sun City. A whopping sum of \$67,868 was raised and went directly to Hounds for Heroes. WHO took

## credit for raising the money.

Product drives are another way that contributes to the total. Throughout the year, many product drives are initiated; i.e., books, toiletries, school supplies, fans and gift cards, etc. for various nonprofits the Club supports. For example, WHO sponsored a bedding drive for Sleep in Heavenly Peace. About \$4,100 was raised.

As you can see, these amounts add up verv quickly. It is amazing to see the outpouring of such generosity from WHO members, Sun City and Georgetown folks.

WHO not only raises money. but has a very active outreach program that continues to grow each year. Weekly and monthly volunteering efforts support BiG in Georgetown, The Caring Place, Helping Hands, Georgetown Project, Key2Free, Meals on Wheels, Head Start, ROCK, Salvation Army, Holiday Meals Delivered, and several nursing homes. A monthly field trip is scheduled to the facility before each of their presentations are given to the WHO meeting. WHO will continue to promote volunteering in 2025.
