I want to thank Women Helping Others Sun City for the generous \$85.00 cash donation and \$3,425.00 (personal checks) that we received in support of our students at The NEST (Nurturing*Empowering*Supporting for *Tomorrow). Contributions to The Georgetown Project make a difference in the lives of over 1,000 local youth each year through the following programming:

- **After School Action Program:** An 18-year afterschool partnership with GISD in all Georgetown middle schools.
- **Assets in Action:** A 19-year strategy to raise awareness about the importance of the 40 Developmental Assets in the lives of our children, in addition to leadership development, service learning and healthy activities in partnership with GISD, WilCo Juvenile Services and Georgetown Parks & Recreation.
- **Bridges To Growth Parent Resource Center:** An 16-year initiative to build skills and confidence in Georgetown parents and childcare providers, and school readiness in preschool children; located in the Georgetown Community Resource Center.
- **Community Interaction Partnership:** A 14-year work-study partnership with Southwestern University where SU students work with The Georgetown Project in school and community-based youth programs and services.
- **Kid City:** A 19-year summer food and enrichment program partnership with GISD and City of Georgetown Parks & Recreation for low-income GISD children in Kindergarten through 5th Grade qualified for the free and reduced lunch program.
- **The NEST:** A 9-year initiative to inspire Georgetown in a comprehensive and coordinated way to address adolescent homelessness. This initiative includes the opening of The NEST Empowerment Center for teens in GISD high schools who are qualified at-risk, homeless or living in transition (Fall 2011), and The NEST Host Home shelter for homeless children ages 0-17 (Fall 2013).
- **TGP Collaborative for Children & Youth:** A coalition of 35-40 agencies and organizations serving Georgetown children, youth and families that has met with TGP monthly since 1997 to collect/publish local child and youth data, map resources, identify emerging issues and needs among local youth, and collaborate to fill the gaps.
