The Computer Club is beginning the process of transferring class registration to an online registration system through the Sun City Computer Club website. Two October classes (Windows 10 and Windows Files & Folders) and all classes scheduled to start in November will be under the new system. The November classes will be available under the new system beginning SEPTEMBER 12. If you are interested in registering for any of these classes, you will need to do it through the online calendar found on the Computer Club website, under Training, that can be accessed AFTER LOGGING IN to the Sun City website. Full directions as well a how-to video will be released next week. Those already registered for the two October classes have been transferred to the new system.
