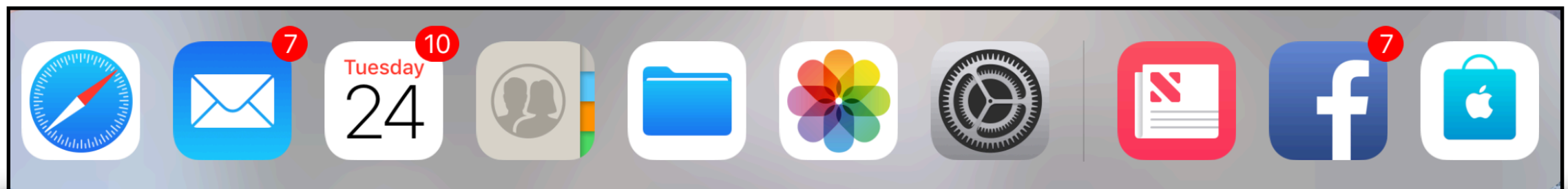
The Amazing New Dock



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The New iPad Dock

- Many similarities to the Mac dock
- It is an app launcher with some superpowers
- Stays put when swiping between home screens
- Can be summoned from within an app
 - Swipe up from bezel at the bottom of screen -or-
 - ⌘⇧D (command, option, D) from connected keyboard



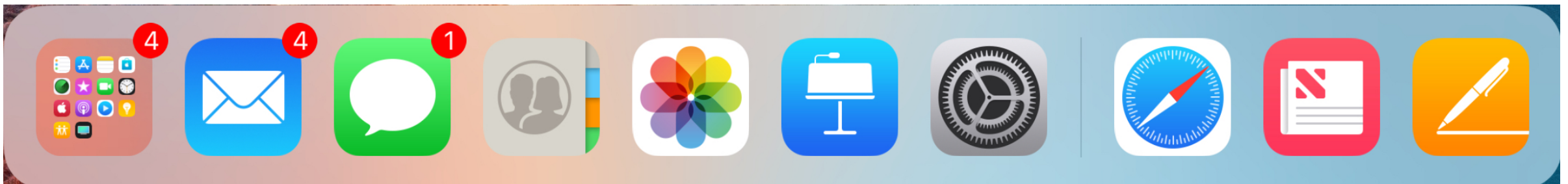
Who Swiped The Dock?

- **‘Swipe up’ previously activated the Control Center**
- **Now, a short ‘swipe up’ opens the Dock**
- **A longer ‘swipe up’ opens three things at once:**
 - **Dock**
 - **Control Center**
 - **App Switcher**



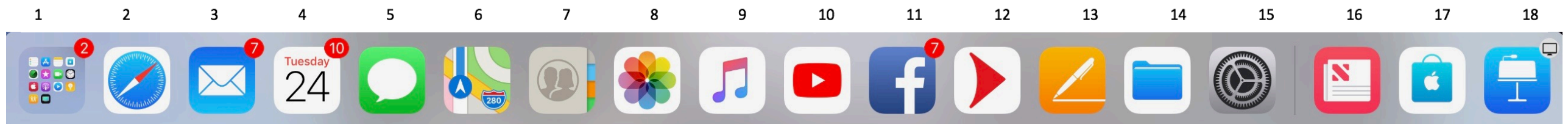
Arranging The Dock

- Works somewhat like previous iOS releases
- Light press on app makes them 'float' -or-
- Make apps 'jiggle' then drag in and out of dock
- Folders can be added to the dock



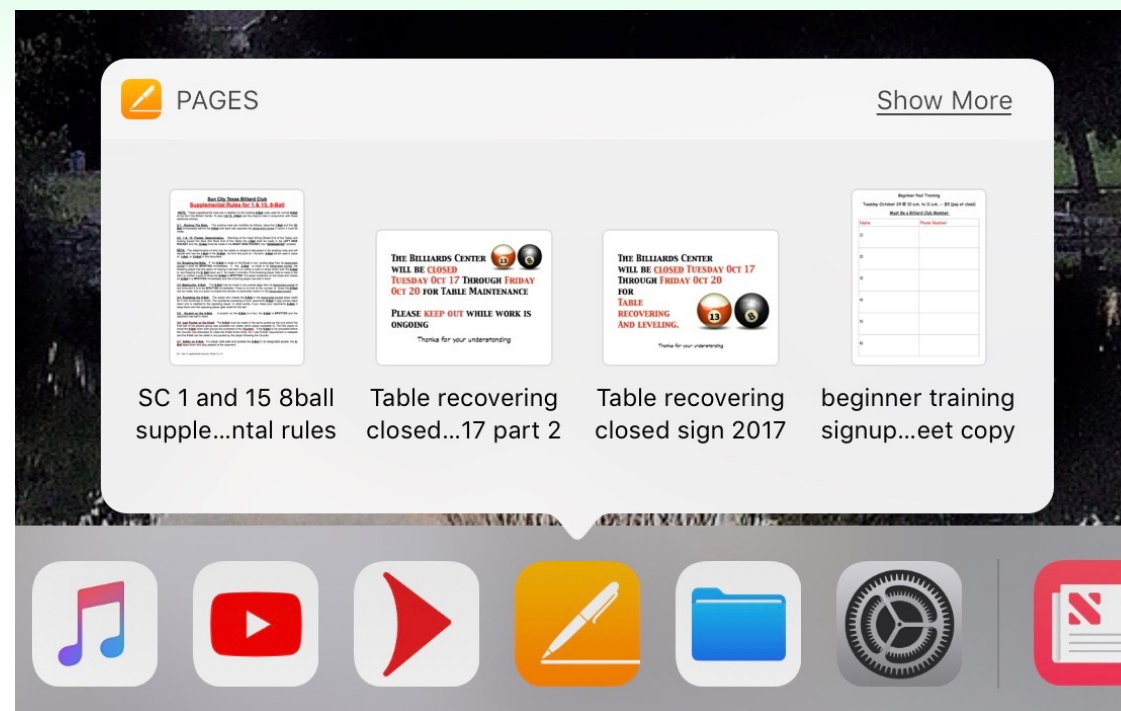
Arranging The Dock

- iPad in iOS 10 had limit of 6 apps in dock
- You can add up to fifteen apps/folders to the dock
- Plus 3 spots for recently used apps
 - If app is in the dock, it doesn't move to 'recents'
 - Handoff from iPhone or Mac
 - Turn off 'recents' in settings if desired

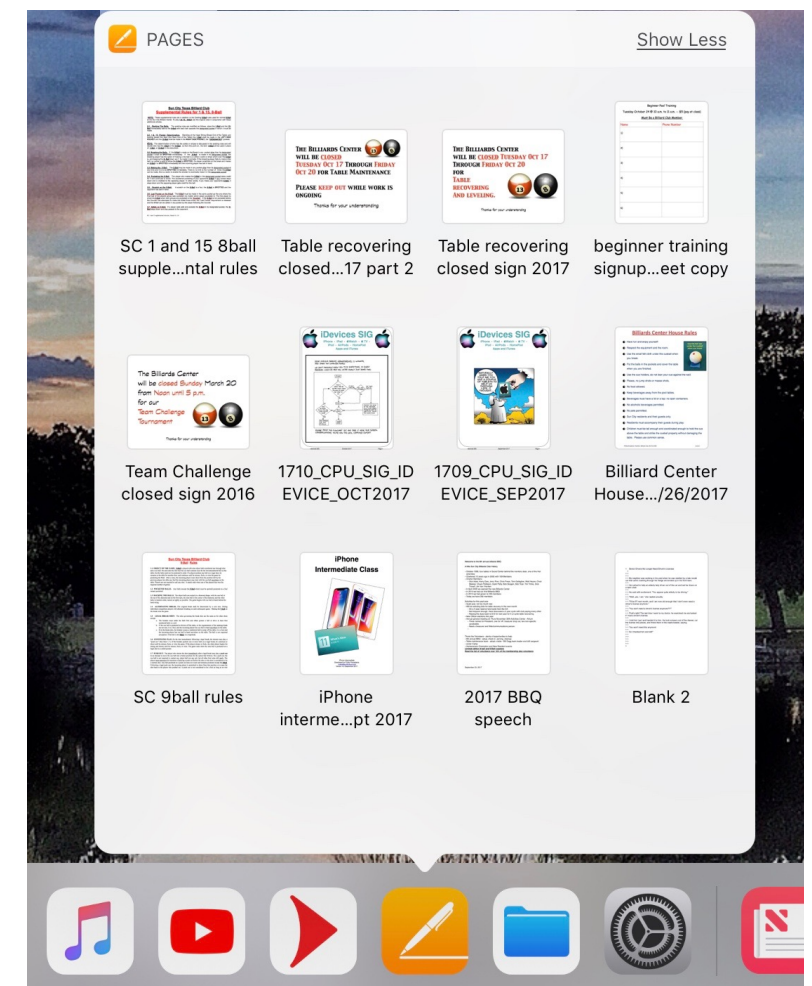


Mac Style Dock Actions

- Long press on an app opens recently accessed files



- Tap 'Show More' to display more



Mac Style Dock Actions

- **Drag and Drop to Apps on the dock**
 - **Safari Links, Files, Photos**
 - **Select multiple items to drag and drop**
- **Drag & Drop to folder - drills down to enclosed apps**

‘Slide Over’ Multitasking

- **Put a ‘live’ floating app window over an open app**
- **Swipe up the dock to select ‘slide over’ app**
- **Drag app up off the dock to the middle of screen**
- **Both apps are live and can be used**

‘Slide Over’ Multitasking

- **Defaults to right side of screen**
 - **Use handle to ‘slide’ left or right**
- **Slide off right side of screen using handle to dismiss**
- **Slide back onto screen from right bezel**
- **Drag and drop to and from either window**
- **‘Slide over’ is persistent even when main app closed**

‘Split Screen’ Multitasking

- **You can have two active apps side by side**
- **Swipe up the dock**
- **Drag 2nd app up and to right (or left)**
- **2nd app fits in right (or left) 2/3 of the screen**
- **Use handle to adjust windows to 1/3, 1/2 or 2/3**

‘Split Screen’ Multitasking

- **You can drag and drop between apps**
- **Dragging a new app into either pane replaces the old app**
- **Slide handle all the way right or left to remove 2nd app**
- **Persistent pairing - apps remain paired**

Slide Over to Split Screen (and back)

- **Swipe up the dock and drag up a 'slide over' app**
- **Drag the handle down to convert to split screen mode**
- **Drag the handle down again to convert to slide over mode**

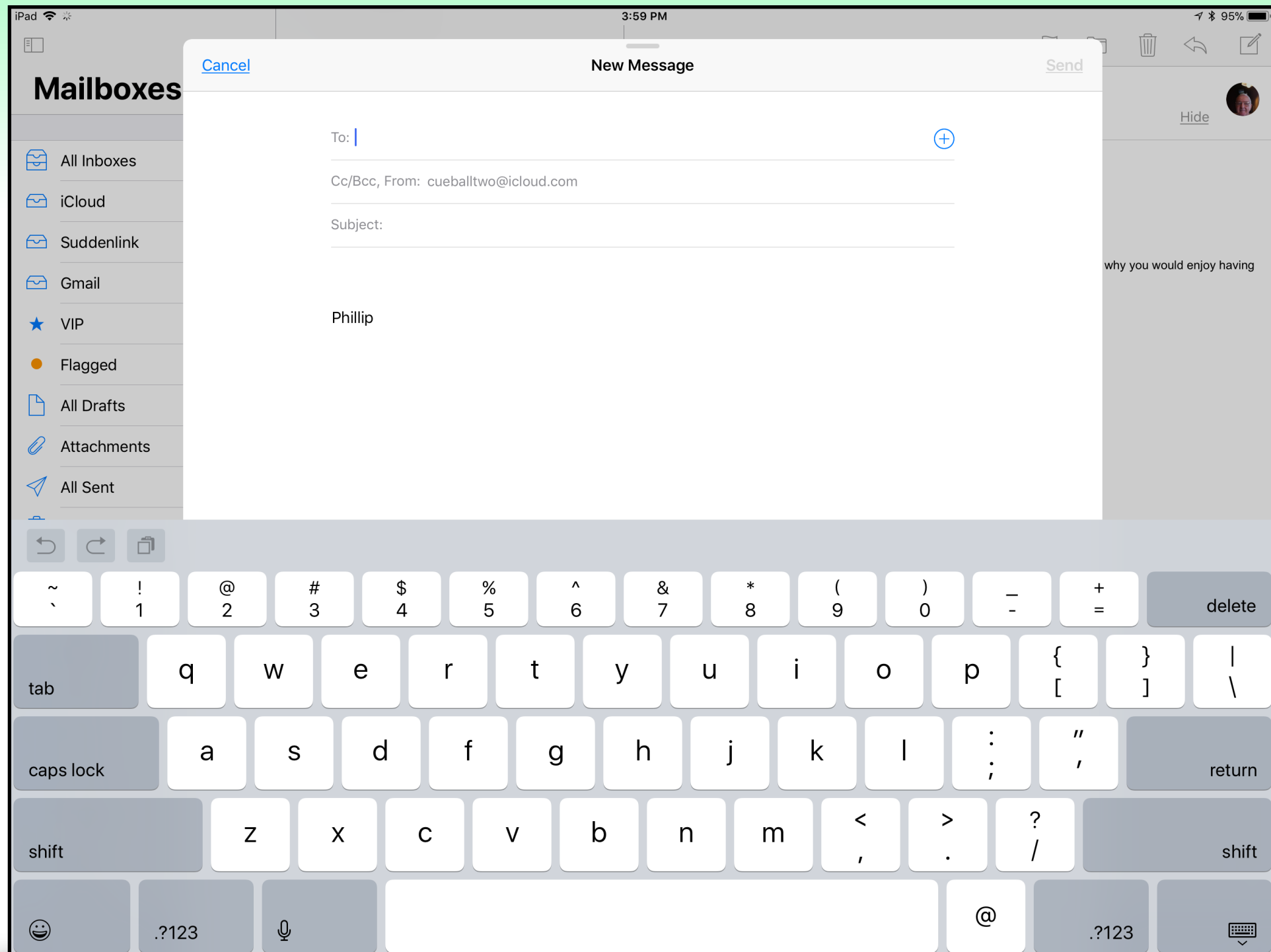
Slide Over & Split Screen

- **Slide Over mode supported on:**
 - iPad mini 2, and iPad Air, 5th gen iPad and newer
- **Split Screen mode supported on:**
 - iPad mini 4, iPad Air 2, 5th gen iPad and newer
- **Most but not all apps support Split Screen**
 - e.g. Zillow

Bonus Tip - Just Flick It

- **No need to shift for symbols**
- **Drag down or flick the key**
- **Slightly different keyboards depending on the app**
- **Apple apps**
- **3rd party apps (e.g. Facebook,**
