• Issue


- Benchmark tests showed performance issues in older iPhones
- Confirmed it had made a decision that this was needed to compensate for the unavoidable degraded performance of old batteries
- decided that we would prefer an iPhone that performed worse for a longer time, than an iPhone that performed just as well for a shorter amount of time.
- Many people feel was purposely slowing phones to encourage you to upgrade.
- Is this right or wrong?

- The biggest issue is that didn't tell people this would happen or offer some type of option.
- Things you <u>may</u> see with an old battery
 - Longer app launch times
 - Lower frame rates while scrolling
 - Backlight Dimming
 - Lower speaker volume
 - Gradual frame rate reduction in some apps
 - In extreme cases, camera flash will be disabled
 - Apps refreshing th background may require reloading upon launch
- Things not affected.
 - Cellular call quality
 - Networking throughout performance
 - Photo and video quality
 - GPS performance
 - Location accuracy
 - Sensors gyroscope, Accelerometer, barometer
 - 🛊 Pay
- é engineered new software that lets iPhone 'self-balance' and take a little longer to complete tasks.


- \$29 Battery Replacement Program

 - iPhone SE is included
 - Store or authorized service center
 - Closest is Brownsville Best Buy

- Due to demand, supplies of replacement batteries are extremely limited for:
 - iPhone 6
 - iPhone 6 Plus
 - iPhone 6s Plus
- There may be a delay in getting an appointment until March/April
- Should you replace your battery?
 - It is your decision
 - Do you keep your phone a long time or update frequently?
 - I would consider it for iPhones 6 & 6s
 - Maybe for iPhone 7/7 Plus
 - will only do the \$29 replacement once per device.
 - Standard out of warrantee replacement is \$79
 - Is your screen cracked?
 - they must replace the screen to do the repair.
 - Why? they have to remove screen to get to the battery
 - This is an additional charge

Security Vulnerabilities


- Meltdown & Spectre Simplified explanation
 - Both relate to a CPU function called 'speculative execution' or SE
 - SE is used to speed up performance
 - SE allows CPU to perform functions it 'may' need in the future
 - These 'future' functions are unprotected and therefore 'vulnerable' to exploits
 - Example entering your address and CPU might speculate your email and phone number will be needed next
- Some good news?
 - No known exploits have been reported, but they are hard to spot

 - macOS 10.13.2 supplemental
 - Safari 11.0.2 for El Capitan and Sierra
 - tvOS 11.2.1 (TV version 4 only)




Watch

- Water Lock
- Automatically turns on during swimming workout
- Manually turn it on from Control Center (CC)
 - Swipe CC up from bottom of screen
 - Scroll down to Water Lock icon
 - Tap to enable
 - Blue water drop rotates through status bar
- Locks the touchscreen to prevent accidental 'touches' from the water.
- To disable spin the digital crown
- Beeping noise ejects any water from speaker opening
- Does not make the watch more waterproof
- Don't worry if you go swimming without turning it on.










App Switcher on iPhone X

- No home button
- White bar at bottom of apps is called the 'Home Indicator' (HI)
- · Swipe left to right along bottom edge of screen
 - Switches to last used app
 - You can then swipe right or left on the HI to go back and forth between apps.
 - Swipe up and to right to see the line-up of recently used apps
 - Swipe to the app you want to open and tap it
 - Press on an app to get the red circle icon
 - Swipe up to remove the app from recents list
 - App will reload next time you use it.







