
USING MARKUP ON A PICTURE FILE IN MAC PHOTOS

In Photos, select picture, click Return (you are now in Edit screen)—click once on Extensions in Toolbar > Markup...then observe the little Markup Tool bar that appears upper left...

For help, Photos Menu Bar > Help > Photos Help > Browse Topics > Improve Your Photos > Add Comments or Draw on a Photo



- ...a good idea: make a duplicate of the picture first & play around with the duplicate
- ...any procedure with "blue dots" indicates it can be changed, moved around, deleted...
- ...when finished, choose Save Changes, upper right or Cancel
- ...can always reopen the Photos Edit screen and choose "Revert to Original" (upper left) to erase all editing & markup
- Draw a shape—select drawing or "cleaned up" shape on left...
- Choose a shape and/or arrow, border, magnifier
- Choose a color fill or no fill for a shape
- Choose a border for shape
- Choose color for border
- Create a text box
- $A \sim$ Change the font, color, size

USING MARKUP ON AN IMAGE FILE e.g. .pdf or screenshot

2)...For a .pdf formatted page, upon opening, choose Preview Menu Bar > View > Show Markup Toolbar OR click once on Markup icon in Toolbar...

3)...For a screenshot that has been copied/pasted into Mail or a word processor, as you "hover," note upper right arrow to summon the Markup Tools to work with...
