Dinks and Dogs Duos

Blue Santa Fundraiser

Saturday, December 8, 2018 from 11:00 am until 2:00 pm - Texas Drive Courts

Let's end 2018 with some "dinking." For the last two years many of our members have participated in our dinking competition with the entry fee donated to the Georgetown Blue Santa program. Last year \$400, plus toys, was donated from the December Dinks & Dogs Duos tournament.

The "Dogs" part of the tournament is lunch (hot dog, chips, beverage and dessert) and is included with your entry fee, and "Dinking" is what the tournament is all about. Categories are novice, intermediate, advanced, and mixed skill levels. You and your "dinking" partner have two minutes to see how many consecutive times you can dink the ball WITH EACH OTHER within the "kitchen" area (aka non-volley zone). Consecutive dinks are counted, and a stopwatch set for two minutes.


The entry fee is \$5 per person per event (includes lunch), and one round of dinking. Additional rounds are \$1 per person and all proceeds are donated to the Blue Santa Fundraiser to purchase items for each child's gift box.

Deadline to register is Saturday, December 1st. Find a dinking partner and email nancygrafton@sbcglobal.net with your and your partner's name, and the category you are entering. Can you also enter at a mixed skill level, or a higher skill level? Definitely, but the entry fee is still \$5 per person per event. All entry fees are collected the day of the event. Of course, additional donations are gratefully accepted.

The tournament begins at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, Dec. 8th, and ends at 2 p.m. Lunch is from 11 until 1:30 p.m. First and second place medals will be awarded in each category, and in the unlikely event of unexpected moisture (rain, in Texas?), the event will be held on Sunday, December 9th, same time.

These ladies have become some of my closest friends here in SC. And to me that is what Pickleball is all about having fun and making friends.


I enjoying helping the club whenever I can. And I can always count on numerous people to be there to help.




The Bathtub Test
