



For more than a century, photographic images were only possible as black and white since neither the film or paper was sensitive to color. Actually, most black and white images were really grayscale in tonality and typically the best black and white printed images contain blacks, whites, and many possible in-between variations of gray. Ansel Adams was a master of such images, as are others such as Michael Kenna. When I began taking photos, black and white photography was still the norm. That "no color possible" restriction made one focus on what was essential but also allowed for great nuance and refinement. Modern digital cameras take color images by default but my photography continues to explore ways to refine grayscale imagery. Presented in this Solo Exhibition are some of my grayscale images taken during the last couple of decades.



#### Ideas for 2019 Monthly Mentor Group Discussions/Photo Challenges:

Using the categories below from the annual print competition (plus a couple more) bring two photos representing each category each corresponding month.

Work with one category for the **2nd Monday** and repeat that same category for the **3rd Monday** to show improvement.

This process would be...a Monthly Category Challenge, then take 2 photos, show the photos on 2nd Monday, then learn from the group review, and reshow two photos using the same photos or completely new photos for that Photo Category.

In summary, after a discussion on a particular category photo we would take that information and return the following Monday to demonstrate our progress.

Categories would be scheduled monthly (the numbers would be the month of the challenge).

Any category can be done as color or monochrome however the #2 Monochrome category would only be monochrome of any subject.

- 1. Architecture & Structures (hand of man/hand of person)
- 2. Monochrome (any subject)
- 3. Landscapes & Seascapes
- 4. Floral
- 5. Fauna (animals, birds, lifeforms & insects)
- 6. Planes, Trains, Ships, Automobiles, Machinery, or any public conveyance
- 7. Photojournalism, Street Life, and Human Emotion
- 8. Night Sky
- 9. Creative (including Painterly, etc)
- 10. Sports Action (Other than sports in Sun City like Billiards and Bocci Ball, we would need to check on the ability of our members to photograph local high school and college sports)
- 11. Dance, Portraits, the Human Form, and Still Life
- 12. Macro Photography
