If you are passionate about photography, you love to travel, own a camera and wish to capture stunning pictures, this SIG is for you.





Introduction to Canon Digital Photography

The purpose of this class is to orient students to their Canon DSLR (EOS & EOS Rebel) and Canon Compact (Powershot S, SX & G) digital cameras. Class size will be limited to 15 students to help insure that enough one on one time with the instructor will be available to help each student learn how use their cameras. The focus of the class will be to show you the capabilities of your cameras and to show you how the instructor uses his Canon Cameras to photograph varied subjects but emphasizing Travel and Landscape photography.
