TREASURER'S REPORT



The Club began February with a fund balance of \$10,978 and ended with \$9,974, for a monthly net loss of \$1,004. Income for the month was \$580.00 from new or renewed memberships and T-Shirt Sales. Expenses totaled \$1,584.00 with the largest cost being a new ball machine. Current finances are consistent with that budgeted. We had 32 new members or renewals in February, with a year-to-date total of 571 members.

New Tournament Rules

Well I learned something new this week. One of our members mentioned that he'd recently played in a tournament where only the medal

matches had referees. He thought that this was a sanctioned tournament and was hoping that his performance would contribute to his formal USAPA rating. It's been almost a year since I was the tournament director for a sanctioned tournament (2018 Texas Senior Games) but the last time I looked at the USAPA sanctioning requirements ALL matches had to have referees. Things have changed! The USAPA now has a Medal Match Only (MMO) sanctioning option.

Here are the basic requirements:

- Tournaments that are new or previously non-sanctioned.
- The tournament must have referees for all winner bracket matches at the 4.0 level and above.
- The TD must submit written proof of these

matches being refereed.

- TD's must provide an opportunity for referee training before and during the event.

And the one that our member was interested in:

- All MMO tournaments will receive a 20% ratings weight reduction.

(Please don't ask me what that means!)

This month's rules question involves players standing off the court. The 'court' is that 20' x 44' area marked off with the painted lines. The 'playing surface' is the area surrounding the court (see Rule 2.A.3.). Rule 4.B.7. states that players can be positioned on or off the court. As for hitting the ball when off the court (part of the original question I was asked), the answer is yes, a player may hit a 'live' ball regardless of where that player is standing (except volleys from the NVZ).

Do you have a rules question? Catch me on the courts or send me an email...I need more material for this column.

And remember, whenever your ball hits the net and goes over for a winner... "If they didn't want you to use the net they wouldn't have put it there."



He replied, "You were starting to sound like my ex-wife."


"Ex-wife!?" she shouted, "YOU NEVER TOLD ME YOU WERE MARRIED BEFORE!"


