TREASURER'S REPORT



The Club began the month of April with a balance of \$10,484 and ended with \$9,573 for a net loss of \$910. Income totaled \$228 with the majority coming from new membership dues and final Swing into Spring BBQ ticket sales. Expenses totaled \$1,138; the two largest being the final payment of \$610 to Dickey's BBQ and supporting items for both the Swing into Spring Tournament and BBQ totaling \$460. We had 16 new members bringing our current total to 601.



FROM OUR DISTRICT AMBASSADOR



Cedar Park
Paddle Battle

Last week, with the very capable assistance of Mary Payne (USAPA Certified Referee) and Stan Payne ("The Voice of Cedar

Park Pickleball"), we helped run the Cedar Park Paddle Battle. This is one of two USAPA sanctioned tournaments held annually at the Cedar Park rec center. And I'd be remiss if I failed to mention all the other Sun City picklers that helped as referees and line judges. Thank you! We're fortunate here in Texas to have so many sanctioned tournaments to choose from (Cedar Park, Kissing Tree, Robson Ranch, etc.). One out-of-state player told me that they only have one a year in their state.

Because I'm often asked to be the referee coordinator at tournaments I get the opportunity (?) To rule on unusual court situations. As a result, I spend a lot of time looking at the rule book. But what many people do not know is that there are rules and rule interpretations that are not yet published in the official rule book. These are in two other very important documents (only

available to USAPA members); the "USAPA Casebook for Referees" and the USAPA/IFP Referee Handbook". Two examples of these are:

After the score is called, the server may not take a practice swing or fake a serve. (Rule 4.M. [Unpublished]). The second is a change to the temporary net rule 11.L.5. When the ball (not on a serve) goes over the net and hits the horizontal crossbar or center foor, or gets caught in the net before or after bouncing, it is a let.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q: Why in the world did the Intermediate Division have to play only 8 point games during the "Swing into Spring" Tournament? Why couldn't we play 11 point games like everyone else?

Here are the alternatives that the tournament committee considered, given the huge number of players who wanted to enter the Intermediate Division:

- a) Limit the number of players entered and have a long wait-list for the Intermediate Division.
- b) Expand the number of players and hold Intermediate matches at the Retreat Courts.
- c) Expand the number of players on each Intermediate Team and have them start at 7:00 am and play 11 point games, given that there would be so many more matches to be played.
- d) Expand the number of players on each team and have them play 8 point games so matches would be done in plenty of time to get to the BBQ Dinner.

Obviously, we chose the last option in order to keep everyone at the Texas Drive Courts and have all play start at the same time. We are definitely open to suggestions for future events and look forward to your feedback.

It's still in development; the committee keeps coming up with more questions to ask our members! Stay tuned because your Communications Director will soon make them stop with the new questions and send the survey out to our 600+ members!
