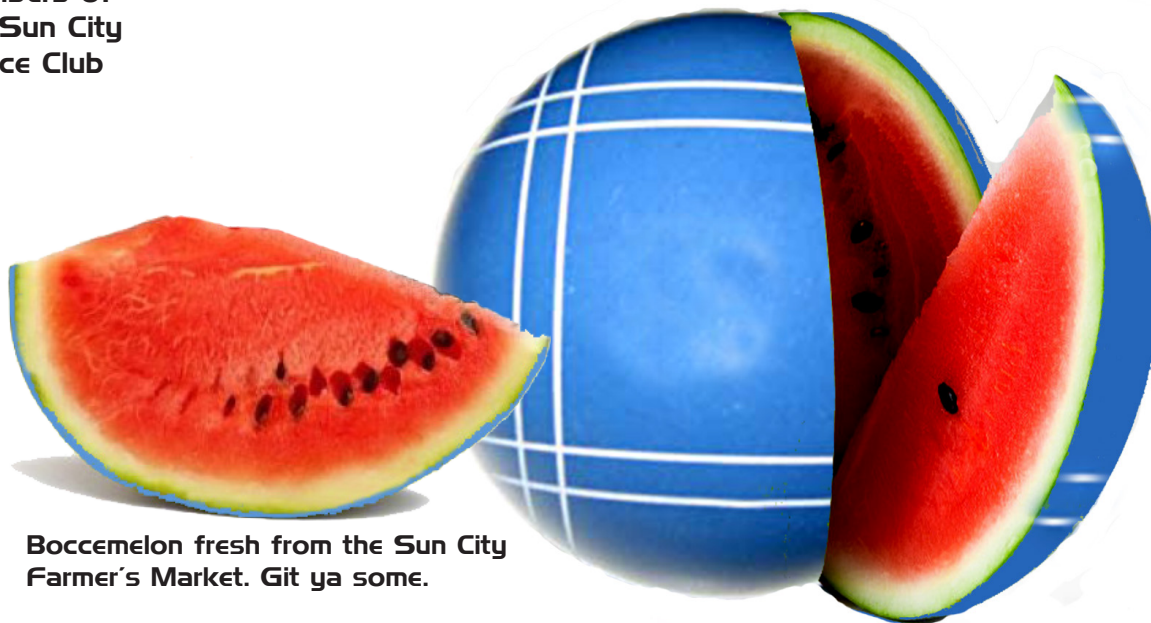

**Seeds of Change.** Rules and Regulations: Two committees, headed by Janet Lull and John Shideler, have completed the "Sun City Texas Rules of Play" and "Sun City Texas League/Tournament Regulations". These documents were sent to members for comment prior to a general meeting June 13, 2019. Four members of the board and 31 Bocce Club Members reviewed and discussed each document. Two items were voted on by the membership: lofting restrictions were eliminated and "kissing" was determined to be applicable to International Rules as well as Sun City Rules. On June 20 the Board accepted the documents with the edits from the membership. The Sun City Bocce Club Legacy Scoring will be the method for scoring all leagues and tournaments going forward. ### **Watermelon Salsa**

#### **Ingredients**

1 1/2 teaspoons lime zest (about 1 lime)  
1/4 cup fresh lime juice (about 3 limes)  
1 tablespoon sugar, Freshly ground pepper  
3 cups seeded and finely chopped watermelon  
1 cucumber, peeled, seeded and diced  
1 mango, peeled and diced, 8 chopped basil leaves  
1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and minced  
1 small red onion, chopped, 1/2 tsp garlic salt.  
Tortilla chips for serving, dipping and eating.

#### **Directions:**

Stir together the lime zest, lime juice, sugar and 3/4 teaspoon pepper in a bowl. Add the watermelon, cucumber, mango, jalapeno, onion and basil and toss gently. Chill the salsa until ready to serve. Add the garlic salt just before serving. Serve with chips.



# At the Core of it all - Court-use analytics

**By Ron Pontiff Bocce Then and Now:** There has been quite a bit of change, comparing June of 2018 to June of 2019. We have grown from 287 members to 355 members. The court-hours have increased, accordingly. Below is a chart summarizing the demands for our courts for those two months:

**NOTES** Court-hours are defined as the number of courts requested, times the number of scheduled hours. Total available court-hours were 2880 (8 courts times 12 hrs./day (8:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M) times 30 days (in June)). Total demand for the courts during June 2019 was 22% of total available hours. Neighborhood play has increased from 7 Neighborhoods to 14. The board recognizes some members are concerned about increased demand for the courts. We are working with the CA, and internally, to ensure the community and the club's needs are balanced. We are revising the Court Reservation Form and making board member visits to the neighborhood plays. These actions will provide better control and ensure the reserved courts are being fully utilized. Club events' court-hour demands have grown by 30%. The biggest growth is competitive and fun leagues. It is the board's intention to continue this trend, ensure open courts and grow the number of social events as well.





## Florence Elementary ACE Program learns how to roll and score.

Students from Florence Elementary ACE program, 24 students strong, were the guests of N58 in early June. After a visit associated with a book drive they realized Florence Elementary is one of the most challenged schools in our area. The idea of bocce play day was the idea of the neighborhood as a follow up activity.

It's not all fun and games at the Florence ISD. They received a 21st Century CCLC grant implemented at all grade levels. The grant drives to improve academic performance, attendance, behavior, promotion rates and graduation rates. Our bocce playing students, all ACEers, are able to receive homework help, tutorials before and after school from certified teachers. The afterschool program includes STEM-focused enrichment activities based on student interests. Other activities include cooking, programming, dance, arts and crafts, outdoor education and sports.

It makes for a long school day, so an afternoon of bocce is a real treat, along with some great attention from some neighborhood bocce players. Joe Marquez challenged them to do as well in their school work as they did in their bocce play.
