#### TREASURER'S REPORT

The club began the month of September with a balance of \$8,881 and ended with \$10,203 for a net gain of \$1,322. Monthly income totaled \$2,183 with the majority coming from advance ticket sales of \$2,088 for the 19 Oct Shrimp Boil; this will be offset by related expenses in October. Other income included \$95.00 for new memberships.

Expenses totaled \$861 which included monthly court camera fees of \$77, gas grill with propane tank and accessories for the Retreat Courts \$455, food items and supplies for the member appreciation Kickball event \$237, and \$92 for

miscellaneous items in support of administrative and training functions of the club. We had 19 new members bringing our total to 689. The 2020 SCTPC budget is available online here (and under the "Financial Info" tab on our website) - 2020 SCTPC Budget

# Fourth Annual Dinks & Dogs Duos Blue Santa Fundraiser

Saturday, November 9, 2019

We've moved the December Blue Santa Fundraiser to November. Why? So that Blue Santa volunteers can purchase gifts with our \$\$ donations before their delivery date in early December. We hope to raise more than last year (\$600) but **we need your help**. And yes, you can always "dink" and assist us in volunteering for the event.

The "Dogs" part of the tournament is lunch with hot dogs (on the Club's brand-new propane grill), chips, beverage and dessert. Dinking and lunch is included with your entry fee. Categories are novice, intermediate, advanced, and mixed skill levels. You and your "dinking" partner have two minutes to see how many consecutive times you can dink the ball WITH EACH OTHER. The ball must bounce within the "kitchen" area (aka non-volley zone - NVZ). Consecutive dinks are counted, and a timer will set the stop clock for two minutes. When the timer says "Start", either you or your partner drop the pickleball into the "kitchen" and dinking begins. You must step back outside the NVZ area each time you dink the ball. When time is called, your team's highest score is recorded in your skill level category.

The entry fee is \$5 per person per event. Additional rounds are \$1 per person and all proceeds are donated to the Blue Santa Fundraiser. ALL ENTRY FEES ARE COLLECTED THE DAY OF THE EVENT. Of course, additional donations are gratefully accepted.

**Deadline to register is Saturday, November 2nd**. So, look for a dinking partner and email <a href="mailto:nancygrafton@sbcglobal.net">nancygrafton@sbcglobal.net</a> with you and your partner's name, and the category you are entering. You cannot enter your skill level category with different partners. I'll send back a confirmation of your entry by email within 24 hours.

This year's Annual Dinks & Dogs Duos will be held at the Retreat Courts from noon-2 p.m. and awards will be presented in each category to 1st and 2nd place teams. In the unlikely event of rain, the event will be held on Sunday, November 10th, same time.

# FROM OUR DISTRICT AMBASSADOR



#### **Ambassadors** and Rules

Occasionally I get asked a question about USAPA pickleball ambassadors and what do we do. That's really an open-ended question. The short answer is...

"The Role of Ambassadors:

Ambassadors are volunteer representatives and unofficial spokespersons for the USAPA in the geographical area they represent and/or at large. Their primary responsibility is to promote and grow the sport of pickleball.."

That's a direct quote from the USAPA.Org website ( Ambassador Responsibilities ). Below that you'll find more specific responsibilities that include; supporting USAPA goals, developing and maintaining the "Places 2Play" program (traveling pickleballers appreciate this), encouraging USAPA membership (have you joined yet?), etc. More active/capable ambassadors get involved with leagues, tournaments, and various clinics.

Speaking of which...

The October 23 "Pickleball Newsflash" mentioned that I will be conducting three referee clinics in November. Two will be at the Cedar Park Rec Center on Wednesday, November 6, 0900-1200 and Tuesday, November 12, 1800-2100. The other one

will be on Friday, November 8, 1300-1600, at the HAYS Communities YMCA 465 Buda Sportsplex Dr, Buda TX.

The clinics are free. We only ask that you pre-register so that we have an idea of how many to expect to attend. For the Cedar Park clinics, call 512-401-5516 or come to the front desk to register. For the Buda clinic, contact Lisa Williams, at dollymomma.lisa@gmail.com.

Now, is case you're wondering why 'You' should attend since you don't play in tournaments (yet) and don't plan on ever needing to referee, here's my answer. Knowing the rules and how to referee a game (Properly!) makes you a smarter player. I often recount the example of two of our members playing in a national tournament where knowing the rules (especially 13.1.) won the match for them and saved them from possibly losing instead. While that may not ever happen to you, I am sure that there will be time on our own courts where something will occur and (if you've attended one of my referee clinics), you'll be able to say with authority, "Well, In the referee clinic I attended, Chuck said..."

Communications Director's note: Every Tournament player should be familiar with the USAPA Official Rules (click to view) and especially rule "13.1" that Chuck mentioned. I can speak from personal experience that knowing this rule helped win the match for Nancy Grafton and me at the National Senior Games in Alabama in 2017. If you don't know what the rule is, click on the Rules link above and find out!

Did you hear the one about the woman who called the dairy and said she wanted a big delivery for a milk bath?


