From The Chair DECK THE HALLS, SAFELY

The holiday season is here, so, let's celebrate in a healthful and safe way. When purchasing new holiday decorations, look for the tag or label stating that the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) approves it. Even when using UL approved electrical decorations, avoid overloading electrical outlets. Also, ensure that there are no faulty wires – these are the most common causes of residential holiday fires.

If a real tree is being used, give the needles a "tug test" by pulling firmly on the needles. If a significant number of needles come off in your hand, choose another tree. A healthy tree will not shed its needles, the needles should not feel brittle, but instead seem "soft" to the touch. There is a greater fire risk with natural trees as opposed to artificial ones. Keeping the tree moist is the best way to prevent it from catching fire.

If the tree is pre-cut, it's important to make a new cut across the bottom of the trunk, removing one to two inches off the bottom. This will ensure the tree is capable of absorbing water. Tip: most real trees will absorb roughly one quart of water for each inch of its diameter, so be sure to top off your stand daily.

Of all residential holiday fires, one in six occur because of a heat source kept too close to the tree. If an electric space heater is used anywhere in the home, be sure it features an automatic shutoff should it be tipped over or forgotten about.

Sun City is Now '5 Firewise Communities"

Sun City is officially five Firewise Communities to meet the requirements of Firewise USA. They are named Sun City Texas CA 1 through Sun City Texas CA 5.

The new requirement is a maximum of 2,500 dwellings per community. Our largest community is 2,242 dwellings. The total dwellings as of October 31 was 8,784 dwellings with an estimated population of 16,250 residents.

Home Ignition Zone Evaluator Training

The Home Ignition Zone (HIZ) Evaluator Training was held October 28 with 10 HIZ Evaluators, 1 new HIZ Evaluator and a Firewise Neigbborhood Partner in attendance. The new Evaluator is Steve LeClaire (N67). Currently there are 15 active Evaluators.

A revised HIZ report form was introduced and reviewed.

A total of 35 HIZ evaluations were made in 2022.

Town Hall - Embers, Fuel Breaks, Fire Breaks, Houses

Town Hall was held on October 4 will approximately 125 residents in attendence. The program featured Walter Flocke, Texas A&M Forest Service, with 'Factors Influencing Fire Behavior in Sun City'. Clay Shell, Georgetown Fire Department, described 'What is a Wildfire?' Christy Rogers, Emergency Management Coordinator, City of Georgetown, reviewed Emergency Notifications, including Warn Central Texas system and Personal Preparedness. Dan Dodson and Paul Ohlenbusch reviewed why embers are the primary source of structure fires from a wildfire and defined fuel breaks, fire break, and fire stops.
