

Green Beer

Step 1: Pour a little Beer in an ice-cold glass/mug, holding the glass/mug at a slight angle - add a drop or two of the Food Coloring to the Beer Step 2: Give only a light stir, then continue to fill the glass.

The Beer and Coloring will mix without being stirred

Green Mimosas

Chill your sparkling wine for several hours before mixing.

Step 1: Add 2.5 oz orange juice to your champagne flute.

Step 2: Pour in a splash of Blue Curacao.

Step 3: Top with 3 oz champagne and stir.

Non- alcoholic Sparkling Lime Mint St Paddy's Day Punch

1 regular-sized can of limeade concentrate
Club soda (about 1 quart/liter)
Fresh mint leaves (about 1-2 sprigs per quart)
Lime slices (1-2 large limes is plenty)
Make limeade per instructions replacing water with club soda. Rub a few mint leaves to start releasing oils and put pressed mint leaves in punch.

The NRO works closely with the representatives from the 84 neighborhoods to ensure two-way communication between the neighborhoods, the Community Association and the Sun City Board of Directors.







Several N64 homes have been experiencing Smoke Alarm issues. Our Smoke and or Smoke/CO alarms are coming to the end of their lifespan.

If your Smoke or Smoke/CO detector needs replacement, below are replacements that will fit into the mounting we have. They are "replacements" that are cheaper than the ones with installation hardware that is not needed. You can find what you need on Amazon.

Smoke/CO First Alert BRK SC9120FF \$31.88 Smoke First Alert 9120BFF \$14.37 Most homes in N64 have two Smoke/CO alarms, one near the door to the garage and one near the laundry room. Some homes will have a Smoke Alarm in or near the bedrooms. (2-3).

To replace, turn the alarm to the left, pull down and unplug the white connector. Then take the new one, remove the plastic tab from the battery, plug in the white connector, push it into the mounting ring and turn to the right till it stops. You will see a small light inside. There is very good information to read inside the packages.
