#### THE HISTORY OF MOTHER'S DAY

Following the Civil War in 1868 a remarkable woman named Ann Reeves Jarvis started "Mother's Clubs" where moms gathered with former Union and Confederate soldiers to promote unity and reconciliation.

> This event evolved into the first "Mother's Days." It was created to heal the rift between the sides and bring together what war had separated.

Ann Reeves Jarvis, who had 6 children, worked tirelessly to help disadvantaged children and struggling mothers in ways to improve health and sanitary conditions and to provide medical assistance and medications to those in need.

In the early 1900's after her mother's death, Anna Jarvis, Ann Reeves Jarvis daughter, who never had children, memorialized her mother's lifelong activism with a memorial service. She wanted to honor her by commemorating the sacrifices all mothers made for their children.

The following year, on May 10th, a Mother's Day service was held to acknowledge all mothers. Thus was born the idea that the second Sunday in May every year would be Mother's Day.

In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a bill designating the second Sunday in May as a legal holiday to be called "Mother's Day."







#### DON COLUMBUS

#### A Man of Many Missions

Don was 6 years old when he got his first job. A lady from his church who owned a clothing store asked him if he would sweep each day for her. Don had his eye on a bicycle that he wanted very much so he took her up on

her offer. Even then he understood that hard work paid off. He saved his money, a small bit at a time, and bought that bike. This story exemplifies Don Columbus to a tee. He has never stopped from that day forward working hard and achieving his goals. Don was born in Kitchener, Canada. He got a job when he was 14 years old in a local hospital and while working in an ambulance, he delivered a baby which could be considered to be the foreshadowing of Don's future. Don attended Xavier University in Cincinnati Ohio. Not an excellent student in



high school, but he became a stellar student who valued the process of learning in college. He supported himself by working for Proctor and Gamble, where the corporate headquarters is located, by testing soaps. After two years, Don's father became very ill so decided to move closer to his family in Canada and attended Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan. He applied to many medical schools and with excellent grades was very

disappointed to be turned down by every school he applied. The next year Don got a master's degree in Biology at Wayne State and reunited in Canada with a girl he had known in the hospital where he had worked in high school, Barbara, and got married. The next year he was accepted by 7 medical schools. He chose to attend medical school at the University of Western Ontario Canada so he would be near his father whose health had continued to deteriorate. On his first day of medical school, a day he calls "one of the happiest of his life," Don received the worst news of his life, his dad had passed away that very day. After the loss of his father and seeing the fragility of life up close, he moved forward through medical school and absorbed every facet with even more determination. As if preordained at an early age, Don

chose to specialize in the practice of OB/GYN. He wanted to be part of the medical profession that welcomed life where so much happiness and hope existed. After graduating from medical school, Don went through the intense rigors of becoming Board Certified and soon accepted a position in Lewiston, Maine. He loved his life in



Maine. He enjoyed his work immensely and even found time to snow ski and play tennis. He was then offered a position in Texas so he moved to St. Angelo. He worked in a very busy practice where in addition to his patients, his position at the hospital included performing countless numbers of sight unseen deliveries for women immigrating into the US. Don's life was filled with many challenges during this time, yet he always found the work rewarding. His first marriage ended but thankfully Don was blessed with two beautiful children, daughter Nicole, and son Ben.



He later married a lovely nurse named Debbie and lived a wonderful life with her for 35 years. Together they moved to Beaumont, TX and worked in a successful medical practice. Hard times crept up on Don at this time in his life when he had open heart surgery two times and had stents placed in his heart valves 7 times. He

continued to grow his practice and began to focus on infertility research and treatments and the medical





During this time, Don also stretched his angel wings and got involved in volunteering in a program in Haiti which served a population who had previously received little to no medical care. Don enjoyed helping his patients there very much. It was during this time, Don was offered a new position at Baylor, Scott and White at Marble Falls to work with high risk and complicated deliveries.

Don and his wife moved to Horseshoe Bay and settled into a beautiful life of retirement. But, Don felt restless and accepted a position in Australia working at a large hospital in Caines on the Western Coast. He truly enjoyed this chapter of his life. It was there yet another unique opportunity presented itself. Don was asked to join the Royal Flying Doctor Service, an organization that provides 24-hour geromedical emergency services that can reach anywhere, no

matter how remote. So Don found himself in the outback of Australia in the most primitive of settings providing medical care to people in every imaginable circumstance. After he returned to the United States, he accepted a position at Dartmouth Medical Center where he enjoyed being "back" in the beautiful region of New England where his medical career had begun so many years earlier. Sadly, he and his wife, Debbie parted ways during this time but Don continued his quest to remain busy, challenged, and contributive. Don, moved back to Texas, and not surprisingly, didn't allow grass to arow under his feet. Loving travel and adventure. Don began working as a locum doctor (a position where a physician moves around upon request to temporarily





relieve the duties of another.) Don enjoyed this flexible time of his life where he could continue helping others in the way that he had done his entire life. In the midst of his adventures, Don decided to move to Sun City. He said simply, "I was looking for a place to retire and once and for all, settle down." And he did that very thing 7 years ago. Don moved into N64 and now spends his days always busy with friends, playing golf, enjoying wine (his wine expertise has made him a cherished leader of the Vine and Dine group) bowling on Saturdays, visiting his son (who lives in Austin) and spending time with his

beloved dog, Kallie. Dr. Columbus still to this day receives calls with offers for work but somehow he manages to turn them down. To top off a very fascinating life, Don's family has spent many years doing thorough research into their very familiar last name. They have credible evidence that Don is a direct descendant of Christopher Columbus.

Don and his family members have even been asked to serve as speakers and panel quests at World Historic Society events to discuss this fascinating connection and amazing family tree. Don has led an incredible life over the years. Just as he started in Kitchener, Canada, a restless child with a desire to work and learn, he has lived a life of hard work, seeking interesting challenges, and has received great personal reward from his profession. #### <u>AKC TIPS IN APPROACHING DOGS</u>

When dogs are on a leash, they feel trapped, so avoid immediate interaction.

- Always <u>ask</u> the owner first before you approach the dog. Pretend you are ignoring the dog and simply allow the dog to approach you.
- Avoid petting the top of the dog's head. If the dog comes up, pet the dog's shoulder, neck, or chest not the top of the animal's head.
  - 3. <u>Don't put out your hand</u>, let the dog come to you and sniff your hand.
  - Stand slightly away or squat, but don't loom over as doing so can make the dog feel uncomfortable.
