- 1. Abutilon fruticosum, **Indian mallow**. Perennial herb growing from a woody taproot and having toothed, velveteen leaves and yellow-orange flowers during summer months
- 2. Acalypha phleoides, **Lindheimer's copperleaf**. Perennial herb especially in partial shed, with nonshowy flowers in a spike at the top of the plant with female flowers below the male flowers
- 3. *Allium canadense* var. *canadense*, **wild onion**. Somewhat invasive, odorous, bulbous perennial herb that spreads largely by bulblets produced in the inflorescence
- 4. Amaranthus (3+ species flowering summertime), amaranth
- 5. *Ambrosia psilostachya*, **western ragweed**. Native clonal perennial herb with deeply dissected, aromatic leaves; flowering in late summer
- 6. *Ambrosia trifida* var. *texana*, **blood ragweed**, **giant ragweed**. Native annual with opposite, large, 3-lobed leaves; an intruder into many sites
- 7. *Ampelopsis arborea*, **peppervine**. Native perennial climber with tendrils and pinnately-2-compound leaves
- 8. *Ampelopsis cordata*, **heart-leaf ampelopsis**, **raccoon-grape** (**raccoon-grape**). Native woody climber with tendrils and undivided heart-shaped leaves
- 9. Argemone albiflora subsp. texana, white prickly poppy. Native, spinescent annual of sunny locations with showy white flowers
- 10. Asclepias asperula subsp. capricornu, antelope horns, Native perennial herbs with several shoots close to the ground, fantastic flowers pollinated by wasps and plants used by butterflies
- 11. *Boerhavia diffusa*, **scarlet spiderling**. Native perennial herb with horizontal, prostrate shoots and during summer deep red flowers in dense clusters
- 12. *Bromus catharticus*, **rescue grass**. Perennial herb introduced from the Old World and widely established in grassy areas throughout the region; spikelets have very short awns
- 13. *Bromus japonicus*, **Japanese brome**. Introduced annual from Eurasia with slender, awned spikelets
- 14. *Buchloe dactyloides*, **buffalograss**. Perennial herb used as a lawn grass in parklike situations
- 15. *Callirhoe involucrata* var. *lineariloba*, **Williamson winecup**. Native herbs common in sunny disturbed locations throughout the county
- 16. *Calyptocarpus vialis*, **straggler daisy**. Native annual less than 4 inches tall, with opposite leaves and small heads having about 8 yellow ray flowers
- 17. *Cardiospermum halicacabum*, **common balloonvine**. Native perennial herb with tendrils on flowering axes and common leaves, flowering in mid-summer and then producing inflated, 3-lobed fruits with hard black seeds
- 18. *Carex* cf. *frankii*, **Joseph Frank's caric sedge**. Native clonal perennial herb of wet ground with large fruit clusters
- 19. *Carya illinoinensis*, **pecan**. Cultivate tree with odd-pinnately compound leaves (enough said)

- 20. *Celtis reticulata*, **net-leaf hackberry**. Native tree with large warts on bark and hairy petioles on the leaves
- 21. *Chasmanthium latifolium*, **wild sea-oats, broad-leaved woodland oats**. Native perennial herb of shady woodlands in Sun City and throughout the region; spikelets conspicuous, broad and elliptic in outline
- 22. *Cirsium texanum*, **Texas thistle, mala mujer**. Native biennial herb occurring throughout Sun City, including lawns and flowering in late spring
- 23. *Cissus incisa*, **cowitch, marinevine**. Climber of the grape family with 3-foliolate leaves, often somewhat fleshy, and commonly attached to bark on trees with adventitious roots, but equally successful spreading in open full sun
- 24. *Clematis pitcheri*, **purple leatherflower**. Native perennial climber in woodland; flowers attractive and interesting, nodding and with purple to greenish blue flowers
- 25. *Cnidoscolus texanus*, **bull thistle**. Native perennial herb with nasty, stinging hairs on all green parts of the plant; flowers pure white and showy
- 26. *Commelina erecta var. erecta*, **erect dayflower**. Native perennial herb of woodlands and margins of water, with alternate distichous leaves and flowers with 2 blue petals
- 27. *Cornus drummondii*, **Drummond dogwood**, **rough-leaved dogwood**. Native shrub of woodlands, in late spring with flat clusters of white flowers later with white fruits
- 28. *Cucurbita foetidissima*, **buffalo-gourd**. Foul-smelling perennial vine of the gourd family with large, grayish leaves and large yellow male and female flowers, producing spheric yellow fruits about 3 inches across
- 29. *Cynodon dactylon*, **Bermudagrass**. Introduced perennial turfgrass with creeping rhizomes and stolons
- 30. *Dichondra*, **dichondra**. Creeping perennial herb, one species in the county escaped from cultivation as lawn or groundcover
- 31. *Dicliptera brachiata*, **false mint**. Perennial herb with opposite decussate leaves, growing in shade in woodland; a member of the acanthus family, not a mint
- 32. *Diospyros texana*, **Texas persimmon**. Native shrub with light green leaves and small, urn-shaped flowers, male and female on different plants
- 33. *Eleocharis montevidensis*, **spike-rush**. Clonal perennial herb established in wet areas and in shallow water of freshwater throughout the region and North America
- 34. Eleocharis spp., spike-rush. Clonal perennial herbs of wet soils
- 35. *Elymus canadensis*, **Canada wildrye**. Native perennial herb, a common grass of local woodland openings with awns
- 36. Elymus virginicus, Virginia wildrye. Native perennial herb occurring shoreline
- 37. *Erodium cicutarium*, **red-stemmed stokesbill**. Introduced annual widespread with finely dissected leaves and lavender flowers with 5 petals
- 38. Festuca arundinacea, tall fescue. Perennial turfgrass often with tall inflorescences
- 39. Festuca perennis (Lolium multiflorum), ryegrass. Annual or perennial turfgrass, with distinctive inflorescence alternate distichous with regularly diverging spikelets
- 40. *Frangula caroliniana*, **Carolina buckthorn**. Native small tree of woodlands, with alternate leaves, small green flowers, and fleshy fruits that do not turn purple until early fall
- 41. *Fraxinus albicans* (*Fraxinus texensis*), **Texas ash**. Native small tree with pairs of pinnately compound leaves and slender, winged fruits

- 42. *Gaillardia pulchella* var. *pulchella*, **firewheel, Indian blanket**. Native annual common in native and disturbed grasslands and commonly planted around homes and along roads; heads with ray flowers having bright red and light yellow flowers and a central cluster of purple-red
- 43. *Geranium carolinianum*, **Carolina storksbill**. Native annual in mixed stands of annuals and grasses
- 44. *Geranium pusillum*, **tiny storksbill**. Annual with deeply dissected leaves and tiny geranium flowers in spring, 2013 by yours truly, first reported in Texas a couple months earlier in Denton County but probably in Texas for multiple years (in Oklahoma, etc.)
- 45. Glandularia bipinnatifida (Verbena bipinnatifida), **prairie verbena**. Native perennial herb found throughout Sun City, low growing with dissected, paired leaves and showy purple flowers during most months of the year
- 46. *Helianthemum annuum*, **annual sunflower**. Native, robust annual with large leaves and flowering during summertime
- 47. *Hordeum murinum* subsp. *leporinum*, **hare barley**. Introduced annual barley in disturbed habitats, having a compact inflorescence with long awns
- 48. *Hydrocotyle verticillata*, **water pennywort**. Creeping perennial herb with leaf blade attached in the center like, with "whorls" (not really) of flowers and fruits
- 49. *Hymenopappus scabiosaeus var. artemisiifolia,* **old plainsman, woolly-white**. Native perennial herb with dissected leaves and an erect canopy with clusters of white flowers
- 50. *Ipomoea equitans*, **Texas bindweed**. Native prostrate perennial or vine in full sun, having white flowers with purple center
- 51. *Ilex decidua*, **possumhaw holly**. Deciduous native shrub, which has male and female flowers on separate plants
- 52. *Ipomoea trichocarpa*, **purple bindweed**. Perennial vine with twining stems and heart-shaped leaves; flowers have pink to rose or darker corollas
- 53. *Juglans major/nigra*, **Arizona/black walnut**. Native tree found occasionally in woodland; flowering starting around now with long, tassel-like male reproductive structure (catkin) and in several weeks female flowers on newly produced leafy shoots
- 54. *Justicia americana*, **American water-willow**. Native perennial herb growing in creek bed at bridge and throughout the region at water edge throughout the region; flowers in mid-spring white or with some violet and dark dots
- 55. *Lactuca serriola*, **wild lettuce, compassplant**. Annual weed exceedingly widespread in the U. S., with pale yellow flowers in morning and leaves often spinescent on margins and oriented edge upwards
- 56. *Lantana urticoides* (*L. horrida*), **common lantana**. Native shrub with opposite leaves and showy orange to pink flowers
- 57. *Lepidium* sp., **peppergrass**. Native annual mustard with flat fruit having a notch at the tip
- 58. *Ligustrum lucidum*, **Chinese privet**. Invasive evergreen small tree of moist woodlands in the county, spread by birds eating the fleshy fruits
- 59. *Lupinus texensis*, **Texas bluebonnet**, **Texas lupine**. Native annual abundant throughout along roadside and meadows, often where reseeded, with palmately compound leaves and showy stalks of flowers

- 60. *Malva parviflora*, **little mallow**. Annual weed, here around the burro compound, with leaves shallowly palmately lobed; the flowers have short, pinkish flowers
- 61. *Malvaviscus arboreus* var. *drummondii*, **turk's cap, Texas mallow, Drummond's wax mallow**. Native perennial herb popular in gardening with scarlet flowers that attract hummingbirds and having red fruits in late summer
- 62. *Marrubium vulgare*, **common horehound**. Introduced perennial with opposite leaves subtending dense clusters (verticils) of white flowers, the calyx with 10 teeth
- 63. *Medicago lupulina*, **black medick**. Introduced annual from Europe, with dense spheroidal clusters of small yellow flowers and 3-parted leaves (aka shamrock)
- 64. *Melia azedarach*, **China-berry, pride of India**. Invasive tree with large, 2-compound leaves and interesting and colorful flowers, but the fleshy fruits are dispersed by birds and this species invades native vegetation
- 65. *Melilotus officinalis*, **yellow sweetclover**. Annual, nitrogen-fixer, strongly fragrance foliage, with yellow flower; this is a weed throughout North America, but this is the only currently known site in Williamson County
- 66. Mimosa nuttallii (*Schrankia*), **sensitive briar**. Native perennial with spinescent axes and in late spring balls of pink flowers
- 67. *Monarda citriodora*, **lemon beebalm**. Common aromatic annual or perennial of summer meadows and grasslands in the county, having lavender to purple (white) mint flowers
- 68. *Morus alba*, **white mulberry**. Small tree, level glossy and with several lobes; fruits a cluster of white "berries"
- 69. *Morus rubra*, **red mulberry**. Introduced tree, this species typically with unlobed leaves
- 70. *Myriophyllum aquaticum*, **parrot's feathers**. Introduced aquatic herb with shoots emergent and having highly dissected leaves
- 71. *Nasturtium officinale*, **watercress**. Introduced perennial herb fully naturalized throughout North America, in mid-spring blooming with white flowers
- 72. *Oenothera calcicola* **limestone gaura**. Native perennial herb common in grassland, with reddish flowers
- 73. *Oenothera speciosa*, **pink evening primrose**. Native showy, pink evening primrose common along roads
- 74. *Oenoothera suffulta*, **wild-honeysuckle**. Native perennial herb, very common in grasslands locally, including in seed mixtures, a gaura with white flowers
- 75. *Opuntia engelmannii* var. *lindheimeri*, **Texas prickly pear**. Native succulent shrub with flattened stems (phyllodes) and large yellow flowers (typically not red in center)
- 76. Oxalis stricta, **Dillen's oxalis**, **wood sorrel**. Native but weedy annual found throughout Sun City, including lawns, with cloverlike leaves (3-parted) and fairly showy yellow flowers
- 77. Panicum coloratum, Klein grass. Native perennial bunchgrass not yet in flower
- 78. *Parthenocissus quinquefolia*, **Virginia-creeper**. Introduced woody climber with five leaflets per leaf
- 79. *Paspalum dilatatum*, **Dallis grass**. Perennial herb often invasive in turf and occasional in disturbed habitats, with a distinctive inflorescence

- 80. *Persicaria setacea*, **bristly smartweed**. Perennial herb at Berry Springs abundant along shoreline and in shallow water of pond margins; this species has long "cilia" on the papery stipules (ochrea) and white flowers
- 81. Phacelia congesta, blue curls. Native annual with coiled inflorescences on canopy
- 82. *Physalis* aff. *mollis* var. *mollis*, **field ground-cherry**. Annual or perennial herb with pendent yellow flowers and tomatillo-like fruits
- 83. *Phoradendron tomentosum* (probably *P. serotinum*) **hairy mistletoe**. Native perennial parasite on trees in Sun City, especially cedar elm; with male and female plants flowering from early January and white berry fruits in the fall
- 84. *Phyla nodiflora*, **frogfruit**. Perennial herb, mostly prostrate and rooting along stem, used for groundcover, and having headlike spikes of white flowers
- 85. *Physostegia* aff. *pulchella*, **false dragon's head**. Perennial herb on margin of wetland, a mint with
- 86. *Platanus occidentalis*, **American sycamore**. Native tree growing along rivers, streams, and creeks, currently leafless but having old pendent, ball-like clusters of fruits
- 87. *Ptelea trifoliata*, **hoptree**, **wafer-ash**. Native shrub with 3-foliolate leaves pleasantly fragrant when crushed, a member of the citrus family with distinctive, winged, papery fruits
- 88. *Prunus rivularis*, **creek plum**. Clonal shrub species of plum forming a dense thicket from horizontal roots; with abundant white flowers in April, this is currently the only known population in the county
- 89. *Ptelea trifoliata*, **hoptree**, **wafer-ash**. Native shrub in woodlands having distinctive, winged fruits that resemble papery discs
- 90. *Pyrrhopappus sp.*, **Texas dandelion**. Native perennial herb with yellow heads wider and flatter than typical dandelion
- 91. *Pyrus calleryana*, **callery pear**. Introduced small tree in cultivation invading edges of woodlands
- 92. Quercus fusiformis, plateau live oak. Native evergreen tree dominant in Sun City
- 93. *Ranunculus parviflorus* or *sceleratus var. sceleratus*, **celery-leaf buttercup**. Introduced buttercup of wetlands with flowers having leaves like celery but flowers of a small buttercup with 5 small petals
- 94. *Rhus lanceolata*, **prairie sumac**, **prairie flame-leaf sumac**. Native clonal native shrub, with deciduous, aromatic, pinnately compound leaves
- 95. *Rivina humilis*, **coralito**, **pigeon berry**. Perennial herb of the pokeweed family growing in the leaf litter of oaks at Berry Springs Park; flowering now and in a few months with colorful fleshy reddish fruits
- 96. *Ratibida columnifera*, **Mexican-hat**. Native perennial herb in early spring with a distinctive basal rosette of compound and deeply dissected leaves but mostly flowering during summer
- 97. *Rubus trivialis*, **dewberry**. Native trailing perennial with prickles and 3-pated leaves
- 98. *Rumex crispus*, **curly dock**. Introduced and invasive perennial herb of wet habits, having large leaves and a thick inflorescence of hundreds of flowers and fruits
- 99. *Rumex pulcher*, **fiddle dock**. Introduced perennial herb occurring in wetlands and disturbed grassland, having an interrupted inflorescence

- 100. Sagittaria platyphylla, **delta arrowhead**. Native aquatic perennial herb growing in.shallow water; leaves are not arrow-shaped, but the flowers are typical for the genus with 3 white petals around many future fruits
- 101. *Salix nigra*, **black willow**, **swamp willow**. Common and only species of willow occurring in wet habitats in the county
- 102. *Salvia farinacea* var. *farinacea*, **mealy blue sage**. Native perennial herb of sunny habitats or along edges of woodland in Sun City
- 103. *Sambucus canadensis* var. *nigra*, **elderberry**. Native small tree growing near shoreline, with opposite, pinnately compound leaves and gigantic, flat-topped inflorescences of cream-colored flowers
- 104. *Sapindus saponaria* var. *drummondii*, **western soapberry**. Small tree or large shrub often in colonies, with pinnately compound leaves like sumac (*Rhus lanceolata*) but not aromatic, flowering before mid-spring whereas *Rhus* blooms in early and middle summer months
- 105. *Sida abutifolia*, **spreading sida**. Native perennial herb of prairie, mostly prostrate along ground and with showy yellow flowers
- 106. *Sideroxylon lanuginosum* subsp. *lanuginosum* (*Bumelia lanuginsoum*), **gum bumelia**, **chittamwood**. Native shrub or small tree with fuzzy leaves, especially noticeable when it leaves out in March
- 107. *Silphium radula*, **Simpson rosinweed**. Tall perennial herb with bright yellow flower heads
- 108. *Smilax bona-nox*, **greenbrier**. Introduced, often somewhat spiny perennial vine common throughout Sun City
- 109. *Solanum dimidiatum*, **western horse-nettle, potato weed**. Native perennial herb of grasslands and partially sunny woodlands, with coarsely toothed greenish leaves and large blue, star-shaped flowers
- 110. *Solanum elaeagnifolium*, **silver-leaf nightshade**. Native perennial herb but often weedy, having elongate, silvery leaves and smaller bluish, star-shaped flowers
- 111. *Solanum ptychanthum* (probably not the correct name), American nightshade. Annual with white petals
- 112. *Solanum rostratum*, **buffalo-bur, Kansas-thistle**. Spinescent annual with sharp prickles on lobed leaves and wide, bright yellow flowers
- 113. *Sophora affinis*, **Eve's necklace**. Native small tree occasionally encountered in woodland but a favorite of deer
- 114. *Sorghum halepense*, **Johnsongrass**. Horrific, invasive perennial herb with aggressive rhizomes and a major competitor in prairie habitats
- 115. *Taraxacum officinale*, **common dandelion**. Weedy perennial herb introduced from Europe and occurring in disturbed areas and lawns throughout Sun City
- 116. *Teucrium canadense*, **American germander**. Native perennial herb growing along water or in shallow water, a mint having 4-sided stems and verticils of white to lavender flowers
- 117. *Torilis arvensis*, **hedge-parsley**, **sock destroyer**. Terribly invasive annual of the carrot family, common here in shady areas, a plant with small white flowers and barbs on the fruits
- 118. *Toxicodendron pubescens* and *T. radicans* subsp. *pubens*, **poison ivy** and **poison oak**.

- 119. *Tribulus terrestris*, **punctureweed**. Weedy and undesirable annual with prostrate stems, opposite, even-pinnately compound leaves, and showy light yellow flowers, but the horribly sharp-spined fruits puncture bicycle tires
- 120. *Ulmus americana*, **American elm**. Native tree growing along creeks and streams, the common local elm with fruits produced in early spring
- 121. *Ulmus crassifolia*, **cedar elm**. Invasive native shrub and small tree of the region, abundant throughout Sun City and considered by many undesirable; currently leafing out
- 122. *Verbena brasiliensis*, **Brazilian vervain**. Introduced and invasive, tall perennial herb of wetlands, having paired leaves, long stem internodes, and a branched inflorescence of colorful but relatively small vervain flowers
- 123. *Verbena canescens* **gray vervain**. Native annual with comparatively small flowers for a vervain and hairy, toothed leaves
- 124. *Verbena halei*, **Texas vervain**. Native annual with slender clusters of light violet flowers
- 125. Verbena sp. New arrival at Berry Springs Park this year.
- 126. *Verbesina virginica*, **frostweed**. Native perennial herb commonly found in or along edges of woodlands throughout Sun City and generator of "frost flowers" under special conditions during late fall or early winter
- 127. *Veronica anagallis-aquatica*, **water speedwell**. Annual, a species named by Linnaeus, with opposite leaves and blue flowers, common in wetlands throughout the country but waterfowl
- 128. *Viburnum rufidulum*, **southern blackhaw**, **rusty blackhaw**. Native large shrub or small tree with red hairs on the petioles and inflorescence; the opposite leaves are leathery and somewhat glossy
- 129. *Viguiera dentata*, **golden-eye**. Native perennial her common along woodland vegetation, during spring and summer with showy, sunflowerlike heads having yellow ray flowers
- 130. *Vitis cinerea* var. *cinerea*, **summer grape**. Native woody climber of the grape family with whitish, velveteen leaves
- 131. Vitis mustangensis, mustang grape. Woody climber of the grape family.
- 132. Zephyranthes drummondii (Cooperia pedunculata) rain-lily, fairy-lily. Native perennial herb with bulbs and showy, solitary white flowers in mid-spring
