SENIOR CITIZENS AND FRAUD: **HOW TO AVOID BEING A VICTIM**

Fraud against senior citizens is a rapidly increasing crime, not only across the United States but even here in Georgetown. Georgetown is home to a large senior citizen population, especially in Sun City Texas, which makes Georgetown an attractive environment for con artists.

Why are senior citizens so attractive to con artists? A common misconception is that senior citizens are naive and make easy victims. The truth is that con artists target senior citizens because they believe senior citizens are most likely to have money due to the "nest egg" they spent their whole lives building for their retirement. Most senior citizens own their own home and have excellent credit. Also, senior citizens generally were raised to be polite and trusting. The con artist will exploit these traits. knowing that it is difficult for senior citizens to say "no" or just to hang up the telephone.

What are the most common fraud scams directed toward senior citizens in Georgetown and across the United States?

THE MEDICARE SCAM

Con artists are calling seniors at home and claiming to be affiliated with the federal Medicare program. The con artists falsely tell seniors that the Medicare program's current identification cards are being phased out and that replacement Medicare cards must be obtained in order to continue receiving benefits. Seniors are told they must confirm their Medicare number and bank account information over the phone in order to receive a replacement card.

How to avoid being a victim of this scam: Never give out personal or financial information over the phone unless the call is initiated by you and you are sure to whom you are talking. The federal government will not call you asking for personal or financial information.

THE PRIZE WINNING SCAM

Seniors get a call or a letter from the con artist saving they have won a prize, but in order to claim the prize they need to send money to cover a shipping or handling fee, or pay for taxes upfront.

How to avoid being a victim of this scam: Legitimate prize games or lotteries will not have you pay money up front in order for you to claim your prize. The taxes you pay for the prize or lottery will only be paid AFTER you claim your winnings.

THE "DAMSEL IN DISTRESS" SCAM

Seniors get a phone call from a young voice claiming to be their grandchild. The con artists tell the senior they have had an accident or are in some sort of trouble and need the senior to wire them money. The senior, truly believing they are talking to their grandchild, wires the money to them.

How to avoid being a victim of this scam: Always make sure you know to whom you are talking before giving out any information. Take the time to ask questions to which your family member would know the answers. If you have any doubt, get their phone number and follow up with other family members (the grandchild's parents) to make sure you are not being scammed!

EMAIL/PHISHING SCAMS

Seniors receive email messages that appear to be from a legitimate company or institution, asking them to "update" or "verify" their personal information. Some seniors who may not be computer savvy will click on the links and provide their personal information.

How to avoid being a victim of this scam: You can purchase software (it usually comes bundled with anti-virus software) that will detect websites that are "phishing" for information. If you get an email wanting you to update your information, it is best to contact the company by phone using the customer service number in the company's billing or on your credit card.

The above list is just a few of the many scams that con artists use to steal your money and identity. Keep your money and personal information closely guarded. Do not give out your personal information unless you initiate contact and you are sure you know to whom you are communicating. If you do this, you will greatly reduce your odds of being a victim of fraud.

Participation

First, I would like to thank all of you who did participate in the recent Sun City Texas Board of Directors election, with a special thanks to those who voted for my re-election. We have a very important two years ahead of us and I look forward to being a part of that.

While not all of us can or wish to get involved in the Board or in the many committees that make up our governance system in our community, we can all participate by voting. I recently learned a few interesting statistics on the recent voter turnout that I'd like to share.

Let me start by commending and giving kudos to the top three neighborhoods: N27 led the pack with an outstanding 92.6 percent of its houses voting, followed by N20 at 77.3 percent and, I am proud to say, my own N31 with 70.8 percent. Our low was 21.3 percent and the average was 39.7 percent—still better than many elections.

Gary Preston, a newly elected Board Member, lives in N27 and, as already noted, I live in N31. Although I can't speak about N27, I can tell you that N31 is a very active group and has several participants on committees and sub-committees, so maybe the active atmosphere does rub off on others.

I am also happy to report that in the recent application and appointment process for new committee members, there was an excellent turnout, both in the number and quality of the applicants.

These are, in my judgment, important qualities that contribute to the continuation and betterment of the great lifestyle in this community that we call home. These volunteers work hard and spend many hours of their retirement time at their new "jobs," but they find it rewarding and satisfying when they see the results.

Thus, I encourage all of you to give serious consideration to getting involved. Go to a few committee meetings—the times and places are all listed on page 8 in the Sun Rays—and see if there is something there of special interest to you. Or if you prefer not to make the commitment to a full committee, maybe there is a sub-committee to which you could contribute with less time commitments. Sun City Texas Evacuation Centers

Submitted by Pat Alexander, Chair, Emergency Management Committee



Emergencies and disasters can strike without warning and can force you to evacuate your home and neighborhood quickly. If a short-term evacuation is called in Sun City Texas, you may receive information regarding the evacuation site

through the CA Communicator, Channel 79, Citizens on Patrol (COPs), the Sun City Amateur Radio Society (SCARS), or through your Neighborhood Representative or Emergency Management Coordinator. Members of the COPs Emergency Response Team will also be stationed at various locations to direct you to the appropriate Evacuation Center.

The following locations are short-term evacuation sites in Sun City Texas.

• Resident Evacuation Center: Social Center Ballroom

If you are told to evacuate to a Sun City Texas Evacuation Center, the following procedures will be in effect:

- When you arrive at an evacuation center, you will be asked to provide your name, address, phone and Neighborhood numbers.
- · Residents without pets: Bring a small Grab 'n Go Bag with you into the evacuation center, including medications, a small amount of food such as granola bars, a bottle of water, a flashlight, a jacket, and anything else for immediate needs. Notify the shelter volunteers of any needs you may have. Larger

items must be left in your car.

- **Residents with pets:** Bring personal needs and your pet's Grab 'n Go Bag. All pets must be crated or on a leash, and must wear a current rabies tag. Residents must remain with and control their pets at all times.
- Injured Residents: A Basic First Aid Station will be set up at the Activities Center to assist residents until First Responders arrive. No pets are allowed and responsibility for pets must be assumed by the person accompanying an injured resident to the First Aid Station.
- · All normal CA facility rules, such as no smoking and no weapons, will remain in effect.
- · These are short-term evacuation centers only. Sun City Texas does not have facilities that meet specifications for long-term housing.
- · Members of the news media are not allowed in any of the evacuation centers. Only the Executive Director, or designee, is permitted to speak with the news media on behalf of the Community Association or the Emergency Management Committee. If you are instructed to evacuate, have your Grab 'n Go Bag ready - Plan Ahead and Plan Now!

Landscaped Maintained Homes News

Submitted by David Longacre, Landscaped Maintained Homes Technician

We are receiving many questions and requests regarding the trimming of shrubs—shrub pruning is scheduled in July, and our CA staff is working closely with TCB on best pruning practices. Crews are instructed to trim plants from sidewalks, walls, air conditioner units and roof lines.

TCB's pruning schedule works by trimming approximately 25 homes in a particular neighborhood during each mowing visit. With this schedule, every home will be trimmed once a month. In order to keep the contract at the same price, we cannot afford to send crews to homes for extra trimmings during the month for continual natural plant growth.

MULCHING & IRRIGATION

The mulching process should be completed in July for maintained homes in order to help maintain adequate soil moisture for the plants and keep the weeds down to a minimum.

Irrigation will remain at three times a week for the remainder of the summer, following the City of Georgetown's mandatory water restrictions. Please contact us if you notice any plant or turf stressing due to high temperatures. Any plants that have died over the summer will be put on the fall plant replacement list, when the weather is more appropriate for planting.

CANOPY LIFTING

As the neighborhood trees continue to grow and shade out the turf below, we have asked TCB to lift the canopies of Live Oaks. By lifting the canopy, more sunlight will reach the previously shaded turf and allow for a thicker, fuller turf.

Bits of Info from Ginny's Desk

EXTERIOR HOUSE PAINT SCHEMA

The exterior "color books" located in the Community Standards Office, in the Billiards Center, are also located online for your convenience. The easiest way to find the paint samples online is to log onto www.sctxca.org and choose the Site Index. You will find the paint colors under "E" > "Exterior House Paint Schema." Since each computer monitor and/or printer displays colors a little differently, and in the cases where you require an exact match, please visit our office in the Billiards Center to look at the books in person.

B-2 FORM

A change in the B-2 Form no longer requires filling in the current color of your home. You still need to give the Series number (located in a table called models), Scheme number, and name of the paint you want to use. Another change is that you can choose a color from the Series 400 book even if your house is from another series.

If you are changing colors, an approved application is required. The B-2 Form is located online and can be filled out in the PDF form then printed, signed and turned in to our office, the Monitor's Desk, or the Member Services Office if you don't want to mail the form. As

always, the B-2 Form is also located on the back wall of the Social Center Library and in the Community Standards Office; we are always pleased to reply via email with a form or a plot plan (ginny.wagner@sctexas.org).

PLANNING

When planning the new colors for your house, keep in mind that the garage door and stucco should be the same color so the garage door doesn't stand out and become a "feature" of your house. The term "trim" refers to the fascia and columns, and "accent" refers to the front door, shutters, and pop-outs like the gable vents. These colors must be used for their designated purpose.

We have found a source for the colors of most houses via email. If you need the original color of your home, please email ginny.wagner@sctexas.org with your address in the body of the email and the words "Original Paint Color" in the subject line. We'll reply with your paint colors once we receive them.

Remember, cottage and custom homes are special situations and do not fall within the standard guidelines. Please check the Design Guidelines for special situations.

Water Matters

IRRIGATION SYSTEMS

From an Internet definition: "Irrigation systems are an artificial application of water used to assist in maintenance of landscapes



during periods of inadequate rainfall." That is to say, when an irrigation system is properly designed and installed, it is for the purpose of supplementing regional rainfall, not replacing it. The best executed irrigation system design can only hope to achieve 75 percent efficiency when compared to naturally occurring rain.

Healthy turf requires a minimum of three-quarters (3/4") of an inch of water a week to sustain it through the hot summer months. This may not keep it as green as the golf course, but it will allow it to survive until cooler wetter months return in the fall. How much is 3/4" of water? A pop-up spray head zone has an average precipitation rate of approximately 1.5" per hour. To apply 3/4" of water in a week, this zone will have to run a total of 30 minutes during that week. If you water twice a week, that would be 15 minutes on each water day. For a rotor zone, including rotary nozzles, the average precipitation rate is .5"/hour, which would be 90 minutes per week, and 45 minutes per water day.

Watering 15 minutes on a spray zone is a long time, and will most likely result in water running off into the street; it would be best to implement a Cycle and Soak program. More plainly, divide the necessary watering time in half and give the program two start times. For example: 7 minutes for a run time, and start times of 1 a.m. and 3 a.m. By programming the controller this way, we are allowing the water to penetrate more deeply into the soil, utilizing more of our soil's moisture-holding capacity. By watering deeper and less frequently, we are also encouraging the roots of our turf to grow deeper.



Athlete of the Month By Lynda Dufour

Julie Roberts, 64, was too self-conscious to work out at the gym in her hometown of Lufkin, Texas, thinking she'd be surrounded by a pumped-up, predominately younger crowd with flat bellies, veinless legs, and taut skin. Not a problem in Sun City Texas.

"I enjoy working out at the fitness centers here because we are all pretty much in the same boat," says Julie, who moved here just over a year ago with her husband of 45 years, Gary. "I don't worry about what the next person is doing or what they think of me. People are friendly and enjoying themselves. I'm amazed at how many different activities are offered here for all levels and abilities."

Julie, a former pre-kindergarten through high school assistant principal and principal, had exercised on and off her entire life, participating in aerobic activities such as walking, running and swimming, but she had never worked out with weights or exercise equipment. ust north of South Africa, on the continent's west coast, lies a country unknown to many travelers, yet rich in history, scenery, animals, and culture. My husband and I travelled to Namibia last November in a return to a continent that has captured our imagination.

The tour company made it easy for us: arranging accommodations in a variety of locations that showcased the oldest desert in the world, the heritage of German colonization, the deadly Skeleton Coast, and one of the world's largest game preserves. They also arranged cultural interactions for us: a traditional dinner (really, Mopane worms?) and conversations with a medicine man, tribal elders from a small desert village, a class of middle school children, and black township residents strug-

gling to find their way in a country independent from South Africa for only a little over two decades.

In size, Namibia is about 20 percent larger than Texas, but it only has about 7 percent of the population of our state. It was colonized by Germany at the end of the 19th century as a way of expanding the land available for a burgeoning German population in Europe. Since

the native Herero and Nama tribes already occupied the best land, Germany embarked on an official policy of extermination through concentration camps, slave labor, and the issuance of hunting permits. Three quarters of the Herero population and half of the Nama population were annihilated. After World War I, what was then called German Southwest Africa was annexed to South

Africa, a status jealously guarded by South Africa until the United Nations forced them to grant Namibia independence in 1990.

Tourists are not drawn to Namibia by the German influence, although that is still readily apparent in the architecture of the cities, in the sausages and beer that are on every restaurant menu, and even in the 19th-century European dress adopted by the Herero. Among the draws for tourists are the sand dunes of Sossusvlei, as red as the evening sky, as tall as the Eiffel Tower, and arguably some of the most photographed sites in sub-Saharan Africa. The desert that is home to the dunes reaches astonishing temperatures (I measured 129 degrees in the shade one day); so, for comfort, as well as the best light for photographs, excursions to the dunes are best done early in the day.



In spite of the heat and rainfall that may only amount to two-tenths of an inch a year, an amazing variety of wildlife—springbok and oryx, in addition to many birds—have adapted to life here.

Small planes flew us to our next location on the Skeleton Coast, so called because fog, storms, treacherous currents and the lack of safe harbors have caused at least 1,000 shipwrecks along these beaches, many of which can still be seen from the shore, the waves crashing over their forlorn decks. Swakopmund was our base for an excursion to a fur seal colony during birthing season, and a Thanksgiving Day cruise on Walvis Bay to see flamingos, dolphins, pelicans, and a few friendly seals that even came into the boat for fish treats.

Another small plane took us inland to Damaraland, known for its desertadapted elephants, which have longer legs and smaller bodies than other elephants. An afternoon drive up a dry creek bed in open-air Land Rovers brought us to a group of 12, some of which were babies. We followed them for a while as they browsed on the desiccated shrubbery and trees. Later, we visited Twyfelfontein, designated a World Heritage Site for its more than 2,500 rock carvings depicting animals, tracks, and where to find water. Some of the animals depicted (penguins!) are no longer found in this area.

Back in a small plane, we flew east and north to Etosha National Park, established in 1907, and for 60 years the largest game park in the world. Its size was reduced by 75 percent in 1967, but it is still the third largest in the world, and about the size of Switzerland. If big game is a draw for you, this is the place to see it: lions, rhino, kudu, springbok, jackals, hyena, wildebeest, giraffe, zebra, ostrich and more are easy to spot here, often close enough for great pictures without expensive camera lenses.

My best memories of our trip to Namibia are hard to narrow down, but here are a few: sipping a gin and tonic while watching a desert sunset flame to its rest; watching the morning shadows play across giant red dunes; holding my breath as a flock of vividly pink and black flamingos takes flight in the bay before me; finding a surprise picnic lunch set for us under a 1,000-year-old acacia tree; seeing rhinos—almost extinct through poaching in many African countries—browse with their babies in the brush; catching lions catnapping;

talking with school children and village elders about what life is like for them in such a harsh environment.

My mother used to say that every place she visited in the world helped her find another piece of herself, and the more she travelled, the more complete a person she became.

Namibia will now always be a piece of the person I am.



July Tips for a Beautiful Water Wise Landscape

When we moved to Texas, we were told, "There are two seasons here: Summer and July/August. You will just have to experience it to understand." They were so right!

Be sure you have protective mulch over flowerbeds and around bushes and trees, both to hold moisture and to keep roots cooler. It is best not to have grass over roots, since it competes with trees or bushes for moisture and nutrients.

In this period of extreme heat when water is often restricted, you have to make choices. Your bushes and trees are your biggest investment, so water them with a deep soak. Your sprinkler system will not water deeply enough, so you need to use a slow drip from a water hose, moving the hose every hour or two to water a small area at a time, or use a soaker hose. This will take 8-12 hours for a large tree. For smaller trees, it will take one to two hours, moving the hose



To prevent trees from drying out or breaking, make sure to soak them deeply!

about every 30 minutes. The next day, use a screwdriver to check if you have watered deeply enough, 6-8" minimum. This slow soaking is considered hand watering and is permitted any time by our water department.

The feeding root system of a tree or shrub is located within the top 12 inches of the soil at the "dripline" of the plant. The dripline is the area directly below the outermost reaches of the branches. When the tree is first planted, the roots may not be far from the trunk, but, as the tree grows, they will grow out to an area at the edge of the branches and a little further. Apply water just inside and a little beyond the dripline, not at the trunk.

Soaking bushes and trees deeply requires much time, but it is necessary to avoid the tree drying out and having broken branches or dying. (See photo.) You cannot tell by just looking at it that there is a problem—until it's too late. If you stop watering your lawn, Bermuda, zoysia and Buffalograss will, in almost all cases, come back; your bushes and trees will not!

GARDENING TIPS FOR JULY:

- · Mulch, mulch, mulch!
- You may have to provide shade for some plants to avoid sun scorching.
- Remove spent blooms. Trim back a few inches to prompt re-blooming.

- Do not prune drastically or fertilize during this heat. Let the plant rest!
- For spider mites, spray leaves with hard spray, especially underneath.
- Raise mower height to 3 or 3 1/2" so that the blades of grass can shade roots.
- If you must treat for grubs, now is the time! Treat only if you have three or more grubs per sq. ft.
- Take care of yourself! Try to work early in morning, and do stay hydrated!
- Spend those hours of afternoon heat planning for fall, which is the best time to plant!

DO

- Be on the tee box at the appointed time ready to hit the ball. Delays here start a backup that compounds through the day.
- Keep pace with the group in front of you as much as possible. Hit, git and then throw your fit if you have a bad shot. Our pace of play is improving, but everyone should strive to play in about four hours.
- Honor the "Return to Cart Path" signs, even if you do not agree with them. Often there is a reason that you are not aware of.
- Put sand in any divot you create and another that you see. The sand is free, and it keeps the courses in good shape, plus this avoids someone's blood pressure from rising when they land in your unsanded divot.
- · When you enter a sand trap, take a



rake and smooth your tracks and your divot. Rakes are not heavy nor is the act of cleaning up after yourself difficult. It is terribly unfair and selfish to leave footprints in the sand for someone following you to roll into.

The MGA membership had more than 560 members as of the end of May. Participation records indicate that 353 players have shared in some \$31,000 in winnings in just the first six months of our fiscal year. We will update this information at our quarterly meetings, as well as in future issues of Sun Rays. Our major tournaments have experienced good participation and our new Tournament Committee is working to ensure future consistency and making improvements wherever they find opportunities. Our weekly play days are still a good way to get early tee times once a week during our hot summer.

The Handicap Committee continues its diligent work in the application of the MGA Exceptional Score Policy. The MGA makes every effort to ensure the fair and equitable protection of the player and the field. All records and calculations of the HC are open to the MGA membership for review and/or discussion. No handicap index adjustment is ever taken without

notifying the player, having a personal one-on-one discussion and/or offering the opportunity for appeal before the HC.

Protecting the field of our MGA 9-hole competition presents a special challenge because the USGA does not provide at this time specific guidelines for 9-hole competition and GHIN allows the posting of only combined 9-hole scores. Our MGA 9 competitions pay our winners on 9-hole scores, not the combination of two 9-hole scores. With this in mind and in discussions with the USGA, we have adjusted the parameters of Rule 10-3 of the USGA Handicap System to accommodate our 9-hole competitions.

Here are the details on our two remaining MGA-sponsored tournaments in 2013:

- Repair ball marks on the green. You should know about where your ball landed; take time to look for a pitch mark, yours and anyone else's, and fix it so that the green remains smooth and rolls well.
- Use the 90-degree rule as much as possible. As the heat of summer comes on, the fairways cannot take the traffic when everyone drives straight ahead all the time.
- Consider joining one of the associations and making new friends and enjoying a little competition. If you will allow yourself, you will have a great deal of fun.

DON'T

- Smoke outside of the confines of your golf cart. The rules prohibit taking a cigarette to the tee and laying it down. All smoking is to be done in the cart and all butts are to be placed in a receptacle in the cart, not thrown on the ground.
- Drive a golf cart with an access flag closer than 30 feet of any green. To be sure, park 12 steps from the green each time.
- Drive a golf cart with an access flag between any greenside bunker and the green or between the green and the cart path where other golfers are

- parking and walking to the green. Those areas are banned from any golf cart entering.
- Wait until it is your turn to start planning your shot and selecting your club. While others are playing, determine your distance and club or read the green so that you will be ready to hit or putt as soon as it is your turn.
- Use the cart paths as a shortcut to get to the pro shop from your home. Even though play may not have started in the morning, the paths are closed until play actually does begin and then only for those playing.
- Go out on any golf course without first checking in at the pro shop or having at least called to get permission. Going out on the course to practice late in the evening is prohibited.
- Hit a golf ball into a neighboring house and drive away. If you cause damage to a house along the course, you are responsible. If the owner is not available, you are to report it to the pro shop.
- Fail to cancel tee times you will not be using. Someone else is probably looking for that tee time you don't want.

These are just a few reminders to be considerate of others and the golf course, so that we will all have more fun.

10 Pace of Play Commandments

Submitted by Erik Beyer, Legacy Hills Head Golf Professional

- 1. Move promptly: Proceed quickly to your ball and be ready when it's your turn to hit the ball.
- 2. Play promptly: Take 45 seconds, maximum, to hit your shot.
- 3. Be quicker on the greens:
 Read it. Hit it. Tap it in. Go to
 the next tee.
- 4. Treat the rules with discretion: Take no more than 3 minutes to look for balls and take relief.
- 5. Do your housekeeping on your own time: Start the round with tees, markers, balls and a ball mark repair tool in your pocket. Replace head covers while you walk. Write down scores on the next tee. Don't make others wait.
- 6. Be cart smart: Drop off your partner and drive to your ball. When you leave the cart, take three clubs, not one. Park behind greens.
- 7. Be a good teammate: Know your playing partner's strengths and weaknesses; help them when you can, move on when you cannot.
- 8. Play the right course for your ability level: Choose a set of tees with a rating of 142 minus your handicap index. Or just tee it forward.
- 9. Demand accountability from the course: Ask them to set up the course properly and, most importantly, to manage the tee sheet responsibly.
- 10. Accept responsibility:
 Recognize that slow play isn't just the other guy's fault.

Editor's Note: Edna and W.A. Heard visit Padre Island each year—not as a vacation, but to work toward saving the Kemp's ridley sea turtle through the Sea Turtle Recovery Project. Read as Edna explains the situation and what they're doing to help.

he Kemp's ridley sea turtle was quickly disappearing from our oceans, but who cared? Well, as it turns out, many people cared, including my husband, W.A., and me. We volunteer one month a year, working with volunteers from all across the country, trying to do our part to save these precious animals.

The Kemp's ridley is the smallest sea turtle roaming the Gulf of Mexico, and was to the point of extinction due to predators and egg poaching. Through years of conservation efforts, the population of this endangered species is steadily on the rise.

Conservation Efforts

In Mexico, where a majority of Kemp's ridley nest, turtle eggs are a delicacy. This wasn't such a drain on the eggs until refrigerated trucks were being used, and the eggs were collected on a commercial basis. Through an aggressive conservation program, Mexico is also helping to save these ancient creatures.

Programs in both Mexico and the U.S. have brought the turtles back from the brink of extinction, but there is still a long way to go.

The U.S. lost many turtles due to commercial fishing in the mid-1900s, when the turtles were caught in the fishing nets and drowned; since then, nets have been improved.

While their numbers improve, the Kemp's ridley still remains the most endangered of the sea turtles, as well as the smallest sea turtle to roam the Gulf of Mexico.

Nesting

Though Kemp's ridley sea turtles nest primarily in Mexico, some of the turtles nest on Padre Island National Seashore and even fewer nest along the Atlantic coast in New England and Nova Scotia.

The male sea turtles never come ashore, they just hang around in the breakers hoping to get lucky, if you get my drift. Females turtles, on the other hand, return to their hatching location when they reach maturity, about 10-15 years old. They lay 50-130 eggs above the tide

line, cover them up and go back into the sea, then the sun hatches the eggs in about 50 days.

Without a helping hand, the eggs can be dug up and eaten by predators. If they do manage to hatch, the babies making their way back to the sea are easy pickings for seagulls and the same predators who eat the eggs.

Padre Island Nesting

From 1978 to 1988, more than 22,000 Kemp's ridley eggs were collected from Mexico, packed in Padre Island sand, and transported to Padre Island where they were hatched, released, then immediately captured and taken to the National Marine Fisheries Service Lab in Galveston, Texas. Transferred to holding tanks, the sea turtles spent about a year eating and growing. Once they were too big for most predators, they were tagged and re-released on North Padre Island. The big question: Would the turtles return to nest on Padre Island or go back to Mexico? No one knew. Researchers waited 10-15 years and, much to their delight, many turtles returned to Padre Island to nest.

Volunteers

How does the Padre Island National Seashore handle the busy nesting times with such a small staff of Park Rangers? They depend on the 100 or so volunteers who join them each year during the nesting season, from April to June.

Trained volunteers patrol the beach in UTVs (supplied off-roaders), walking, biking and jogging. As these sea turtles are an endangered species, no one other than a Park Ranger is allowed to touch the eggs, so a Park Ranger usually rides along with volunteers in the UTVs. The walkers (that's my part!) look for a turtle or nest and, once found, instantly call it in to the office and a Park Ranger is immediately dispatched. The eggs are then carefully removed from the nest and taken to the incubation room.

Baby turtles are released above the tide line within a day or two of hatching. Exposure to the surf and sand in this natal stage is necessary—the turtles collect information in a process called "imprinting" that allows them to return

when they reach maturity.

Volunteers also provide office support; W.A. is usually on the radio fielding calls and noting information, although he also participates in "egg runs." When a turtle lays eggs at a good distance from the

National Seashore, the call comes in and a volunteer is sent in a government vehicle to pick up the eggs and bring them to the incubation room. W.A. is an egg runner par excellence (that means he's very good). Depending on the distance, it



can be a 12-14 hour day, with few stops as the eggs must be in the incubator as quickly as possible. On one run, W.A. returned after midnight. No matter how late the arrival back at the park, there is always a dedicated Park Ranger there to put the eggs away.

Rewards

Watching the release of the babies is well attended by both volunteers and those who live or are visiting in the area. It is something to see as these tiny crea-

tures, newly hatched, make a bee-line for the sea. Attracted by the sun on the water, they head off. Being young, they don't move very quickly and often pause on their journey, which makes them an excellent snack for the many sea gulls waiting for breakfast. The crowd discourages the birds—they will not come close with so many people there.

This program is working, and we're hopeful that funding won't be cut, which might mean the extinction of these won-

derful and very ancient animals. With some help from volunteers, it just may be possible that these turtles will be on earth for future generations. That is something the volunteers, including myself, see as their legacy and something of which to be proud.

About me



As it turned out, they all met their future spouses here and settled in Houston and Dallas. That made our decision to "retire" in Sun City Texas an easy one. We now have six grand-children within driving distance.

My transition toward a new career in personal training began during the rehabilitation that followed bypass surgery in 2005. I've been involved in fitness programs of one sort or another all my life, but it was during my recovery that I really began to focus on the importance of physical well-being and nutrition. I received my Personal Trainer certification from the Cooper Institute in Dallas and



recently completed my Masters Personal Training certification there.

Aside from work, I'm a proud member of the Sun City Rotary Club. We meet every Tuesday at noon at Cowan Creek Amenity Center, and visitors are always welcome. Rotary does a lot of great things for the community, including Breakfast with Santa; toys and groceries are provided to families that really need them.

Another community activity that's important to me is Georgetown ISD's mentor program. I mentor a 7-year-old first-grader at Ford Elementary. We always need more volunteers, because lots of kids are waiting for mentors. It takes very little time and it's a very rewarding experience.

How long have you been with the CA?

I've been with the CA for five years. In addition to working full time as a Personal Trainer at the Sun City Texas Fitness Centers, I have also served on the board of the Sports Committee.

What does your job entail?

First and foremost, I am a Personal Trainer. Recently, I have taken on the responsi-







Sun City Texas resident Bill Boyce has patriotism rooted deep in his bones, going back to our founding fathers (his ancestors).


illiam "Bill" Boyce, born in 1918 and currently a resident of Sun City Texas, is a direct descendant of Presidents and Founding Fathers! And what a remarkable truth that is.

I wouldn't call him a name dropper, but Boyce is definitely proud of his heritage, and who wouldn't be? He boasts these famous names to be included on his genealogy tree.

Oliver Wolcott (1726-1797) — Connecticut's fourth Governor. Also a Founding Father and signer of the Declaration of Independence.

John Adams (1735-1826) — Our country's first Vice President and the second President of the United States of America. He was a Founding Father who signed the Declaration of Independence adopted in 1776, and he was the father of our sixth President, John Quincy Adams.

For years, Boyce has created a family lineage tracing back to before the Revolutionary War; a complicated, intricate web of family history. And, if there is one thing Bill Boyce is, it's an intricate



Bill has spent years creating a handdrawn family tree; the above clip is only a fraction of the large family history.


worker. He grew up in Orange, New Jersey, and eventually became a design engineer—first, aiding in the production of military aircraft, then creating tools and equipment designed for space use. He has more than 70 patents under his belt for all of his inventions. Along with creating tools and high-tech equipment, Boyce is also a wonderful painter, with dozens of his watercolors lining the walls of his home—he was even the first president of Sun City Texas' Visual Arts Club.

After researching his rich family history,

Boyce surely has some stories to tell. He especially enjoys telling the story about a group of patriots who, at the end of the Revolutionary War, coveted the 4,000 pounds of lead contained in an equestrian statue of King George III that stood on Bowling Green in lower New York. Naturally, the King was no longer in favor, so they took axes to the statue, tore it down and carried it by dark of night to Wolcott's home in Connecticut where he and President Washington supervised the melting of lead that resulted in the manufacture of 42.088 bullets, only about half of what the 4,000 pounds should have yielded. Additional statue pieces have been found through the years, and the search continues today.

As Independence Day approaches, it must be rather remarkable to know that one of our own in Sun City Texas is descended from at least two of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. Also descending from these patriots were Boyce's father, Robert Rankin Boyce, and his grandfather on his father's side, George Adams Boyce. He's a very proud man, and rightly so.



n a recent CA-sponsored trip to Lafayette, Louisiana, I enjoyed wonderful Cajun food, great sightseeing, and the usual friendly bus-mates. One of the highlights of the trip—and there were many—was to meet the Second Vice President of the Live Oak Society. (Personally, I wondered why we couldn't meet the president, but it was a wonderful surprise to meet this officer and to admire the dignity of an elderly statesman.)

The Live Oak Society is an exclusive society of almost 6,300 members. In order to be a member, you have to be a Live Oak tree, have a girth of at least eight feet, and be registered by the Chairman, the only human in the club. After the incredible Cajun food, some of us Sun Citians felt that we could qualify for the eight-foot girth, but, as we aren't trees, we were turned down. Only the largest, and consequently the oldest, trees qualify for membership and, like all dis-

tinguished and elderly personages, they are valued, cared for and admired. The largest Live Oak trees hold the offices of President and First and Second Vice President.

The Second Vice President of the club, whom we "met," is the 500-year-old St. John Cathedral Live Oak. It is young for a Live Oak, as they can hit 1,500 years-plus. It began growing about the time Columbus was sailing to discover America. It is 29 feet in diameter, stands a stately 126 feet tall, with a spread of 148 feet at the widest. It has a large horizontal limb that engineering consultants estimate weighs 72 tons.

If you think that's big, keep in mind the current President, the "Seven Sisters Oak." It was named by Carole Hendry, one of seven sisters, and is located in Lewisburg, Louisiana. As President, it is estimated to be 1,500 years old with a girth of 38 feet.

This wonderful and unusual trip made all of us feel we had really experienced



the Cajun culture. We boated through the bayous, watched alligators floating through the swamps, saw oak trees romantically draped in Spanish moss, perused the rooms of antebellum mansions, and, of course, ate and ate and ate shrimp, crawfish and gumbo, and let's not forget the Po' Boy Shrimp Sandwiches—they were to die for. A trip to be remembered, with treasured memories.





It started as a backyard game on an old badminton court in the state of Washington in 1965. The game has especially gained popularity among people over age 50 because the low-impact sport is less strenuous on the joints, since it's played on a smaller court.

"It's fun, it's competitive where you're challenging yourself, but the skill level is much less," said Mike Jizmejian, a pickleball coach.

"You don't run as much. You get some same hand action, the same foot work, the same thought process, but you just don't run as much so it's easier on your body," said Ken Robsion, who picked up the game recently.

The impact on your wallet is less expensive than tennis since the equipment is cheaper. A pickleball paddle can cost around \$20-\$70, and a pickleball just a couple of dollars.

Today more than 100,000 people play the sport on at least 5,000 courts nationwide and membership in the organization increased more than six fold from 2006 to 2010 according to the USA Pickleball Association.

Del Webb has been modifying tennis and basketball courts for pickleball for the past five years. More than half of the 50-plus Del Webb communities now offer pickleball.






